TITLE: Motion Approving a 2019 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Local

Solicitation Grant Memorandum of Understanding - (Commission Districts

1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission approve a 2019 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Local Solicitation Grant Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), in substantially the form attached, and authorize execution of the MOU.

Background

The City has in the past been awarded and accepted the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (Byrne/JAG) Local Solicitation Program funding. The State receives these funds from the Department of Justice and then passes these funds through to units of local government. The City of Pompano Beach manages the FY 2019 Byrne/JAG allocations for all cities in Broward County. This award was originally approved by City Commission on October 2, 2019 via CAM #19-0828. Since that time, terms of the grant agreement were changed to include a reduction of awarded funds, in order to add Broward County as a sub recipient, and the grant performance end date was extended by one year. The delays were compounded as DOJ added more requirements on Pompano Beach as the administrating entity. The revised FY2019 Byrne/JAG terms as listed in the grant agreement were approved on May 2, 2023 via CAM #23-0396.

In July 2023, Pompano Beach provided a MOU to be executed by all Byrne/JAG sub recipients as required by the Department of Justice as Broward County is considered a disparate group. Units of local government identified by BJA as disparate must select a fiscal agent that will submit a joint application for the allocation to include all disparate municipalities. A memorandum of understanding (MOU) that identifies which jurisdiction will serve as the applicant or fiscal agent for joint funds must be completed and signed by the authorized representative for each participating jurisdiction.

Byrne/JAG funding can be used for any local law enforcement initiative, and the City is permitted to use its discretion in deciding which projects to fund. The Fort Lauderdale Police Department has been awarded \$74,280.60 in FY2019 Byrne/JAG funding. This funding will be used to support our agency's transition to a new FBI- mandated reporting system and to replace decades-old protective helmets for Patrol personnel. The grant period is October 1, 2018, through September 30, 2024.
