**TITLE**: Qualified Target Industry (QTI) Tax Refund Incentive for Project Bamboo

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution recommending that Project Bamboo be approved as a Qualified Target Industry Business Applicant pursuant to Section 288.106, Florida Statutes, and providing that funds are available as local financial support through the Qualified Target Industry (QTI) Program.

## Background

Project Bamboo is a technology company focused on software development and business solutions. The successful recruitment of this established company will create 35 high-skill/high-wage jobs in the high-tech industry for over the next 3 years.

The total QTI award will be \$7,000 per job or \$245,000. The State of Florida will provide 80% (\$196,000) of the QTI award, with the remaining 20% (\$49,000) being provided by the City of Fort Lauderdale, paid out over a 4-year period beginning in Fiscal Year 2016.

Highlights of the incentive award:

- > Project Bamboo will create 35 new jobs.
- Average employee wages are in excess of 200% of the private sector average wage in Broward County, with an average annual wage of at least \$43,899. Average wages for Project Bamboo are \$87,798.
- ➤ The total estimated capital investment for Project Bamboo will be \$4.2 million for initial renovations, manufacturing and office equipment purchases and R&D equipment over the course of 3 years.
- Approval of Project Bamboo would add to the recent list of expansion and job growth announcements by companies such as: Citrix, Nystar and Prolexic Technologies.
