TITLE: Motion to approve purchase agreement for replacement resurfacing at

Joseph Carter Park Playground – Palm Beach County 10072 - \$66,880

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the agreement, in substantially the form attached, for the purchase of replacement resurfacing at Joseph Carter Park playground from Playmore West, Inc. in the amount of \$66,880 in accordance with prices contained in Palm Beach County Contract 10072, contingent upon approval of the corresponding budget amendment set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo 14-0857.

Background

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting approval to purchase the replacement of mulch with an artificial turf surface for the playground at Joseph Carter Park. This surface will provide a safe and accessible surface, which is American with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant, for Fort Lauderdale neighbors and visitors.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(7) of the Code of Ordinances, this purchase will be made in accordance with Palm Beach County Contract 10072 from Playmore West, Inc. in the amount of \$66,880, whereby such contract or formal bid followed formal bid procedures of sealed written bids, public opening, and legal advertising.

Funds totaling \$85,000 are being allocated from the Orange Bowl Field at Carter Park project (P11784.345) for this purchase. Additional recycled picnic tables, benches and bike racks will be purchased with the remaining funds.

Resource Impact

Contingent upon approval of agenda item 14-0857, the consolidated budget amendment, there will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$66,880.
