WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 21-196, adopted on September 13, 2021, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, adopted the Final Revised FY 2022 All Funds Budget for the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 21-186, adopted on September 13, 2021, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, adopted the City of Fort Lauderdale Final FY 2022 - FY 2026 Community Investment Plan for the Fiscal Years beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2026;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the City of Fort Lauderdale's Final Revised FY 2022 All Funds Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022, is hereby amended by appropriating and transferring funds as set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo #21-0928, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That the City of Fort Lauderdale's Final FY 2022 - FY 2026 Community Investment Plan for the Fiscal Years beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2026, to the extent appropriated for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022, is hereby amended by appropriating and transferring funds as set forth in City Commission Agenda Memo #21-0928.

TITLE: Resolution Approving the Consolidated Budget Amendment to Fiscal Year

2022 - Appropriation - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Budget and FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and abandoning the Central Beach Wayfinding & Information Signage project.

Background

Examples of recommended actions within the budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds;
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- · transfer between capital projects;
- acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- amendment to staffing level;
- · appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2022 Final Budget and FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan, as revised, by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

Parks and Recreation

A. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Cemetery System – Operations Fund – Irrigation Upgrades Sunset Memorial Garden - \$20,760

On January 9, 2020, the Cemetery Board approved an upgrade to an Irrigation Automated System, in an amount not to exceed \$450,000. The budget for the project was approved on CAM 20-0088 on March 3, 2020. The Request for Proposal (RFP) went to bid, and the quotes received were more than the estimated amount approved for the irrigation automated system in January 2020. On July 9, 2020, the Cemetery Board approved an additional \$175,000 bringing the total project to \$625,000 to upgrade the irrigation system. The final award total came in at \$645,760. On September 16, 2021, the Cemetery Board approved an additional \$20,760 for the project.

Funding is available for this purpose within the Cemetery System – Operations Fund Balance.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan (CIP) in the amount of \$20,760 to increase the budget to replace the irrigation system located at Sunset Memorial Garden.

B. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Park Impact Fee Projects Fund – George English Park Boat Ramp Project - \$145,120

The George English Park boat ramp, located at 1101 Bayview Drive, was originally designed to serve smaller watercraft due to height restrictions of the Sunrise Boulevard Bridge. The newly constructed Sunrise Boulevard Bridge provides increased height access to larger vessels that cannot be served at the existing boat ramps. The project scope includes the removal of the existing docks, new pilings, four new floating docks at two boat ramps and sidewalk replacements.

The construction contract was awarded to Sagaris Corp., on December 3, 2019 (CAM #19-1143) and the project is currently under construction. Additional funding is being requested for an Environmental Assessment that is required as part of the South Florida Water Management District permit and project management fees.

Funding is available in the Park Impact Fee Projects Fund for these additional costs.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$145,120 for the George English Boat Ramp Project.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 - 2026 Community Investment Plan (CIP) by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$5,913.50 for the Mills Pond Park New Restrooms Project.

E. Appropriation of Grant Funds and Transfer of Grant Match Funds – General Fund, Grant Fund – Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) – Waterways Assistance Program (WAP) Engine Replacement Grant - \$92,000

In April 2021, the City applied to the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) for funding through their FY2021 Waterways Assistance Program (WAP). The grant program provides funding assistance to local governments to perform waterway improvement projects as well as for the purchase of marine law enforcement related equipment.

The City of Fort Lauderdale submitted a project proposal in the amount of \$92,000 for the purchase of two sets of outboard motors to replace old and malfunctioning engines. Fort Lauderdale has been awarded \$46,000 in FIND funding towards the purchase of the motors. The City will meet the grant's required 50% cash match by funding the balance of the cost in the amount of \$46,000 through the General Fund Grant Match account. The grant period is October 1, 2021, through September 20, 2023.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 Operating Budget in the amount of \$92,000 for the acceptance of the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) grant.

G. Transfer from Capital Project to Operating Budget – Water and Sewer - Operations Fund, Water & Sewer General Capital Projects Fund – Utilities Engineering Operations - \$307,302.83

The FY 2022 - FY 2026 Community Investment Plan includes \$30 million in anticipated debt funded capital for the implementation of Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) throughout the water distribution system. AMI refers to using a system of water meters that connect through a communication network to a central database, and software that allows the capability to provide real-time monitoring of water use by the customer. This project will allow the City to move from the current aging water metering system to an AMI system as newer technology offers many benefits including, improved accuracy of water meter readings, the opportunity for customers to receive automated alerts for leaks, monitor their own usage, and the elimination of costs for a manual water meter reading.

Funding is being requested in the amount of \$200,000 for consulting services to assist with the development of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the AMI implementation. The RFP will be used to seek proposals from AMI providers in a traditional procurement method, enabling the City to obtain cost-competitive proposals from vendors to supply the equipment and provide services to achieve the AMI program goals.

Funding in the amount of \$307,302.83 is available in the Pump Station A-13 Redirection E of Federal project, which is complete. The remaining \$107,302.83 is recommended to be returned to the Water & Sewer General Capital Projects Fund balance.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and FY 2022 Operating Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the amount of \$307,302.83 for consulting services for the AMI implementation and transfer to fund balance.

H. Transfer between Capital Projects - Water and Sewer General Capital Project Fund - Triplex Pumping Station Rehabilitation - \$750,000

This project is for the rehabilitation and upgrade of nine triplex sewage pumping stations that were constructed in the 1970's and have exceeded their life expectancy. The project scope includes the removal and replacement of all mechanical, electrical and ventilation equipment, replacement of all pumps, pipes, valves, suction and discharge piping, rerouting of discharge piping, repairs, and protective coating of the wet well, relocation of all controls to outside of the station, and any structural repairs needed for pump stations A-8, A-20, A-22, A-23, A-27, A-29, A-31, B-4, and B-11. Additional funding is being requested for design, permitting and in-house project management fees.

Funding in the amount of \$750,000 is available in the 18" Force main Replacement Across New River from 9th Street to N. Birch Road project which is substantially completed under budget and has funding available for this project.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY2022 - FY2026 Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$750,000 for the Triplex Pumping Station Rehabilitation Project.

I. Appropriation of Grant Funds – Stormwater Fund – State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection Grant Award for NW 21st Avenue Pipe Rehabilitation - \$750,000

The City of Fort Lauderdale was awarded a grant of up to \$750,000 from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) for the construction of the NW 21st Avenue Pipe Rehabilitation Stormwater Improvements project. This project focuses on the rehabilitation of a 54-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) located along NW 21St Avenue between NW 6th Street (Sistrunk Blvd) and the New River, measuring approximately 1,550 (LF).

There is no required City local match funding required to accept this grant. The grant will fund approximately 75 percent of the project cost.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY2022 – FY2026 Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$750,000 for the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protect Grant Award to fund the NW 21st Avenue Pipe Rehabilitation Stormwater Improvements project. This item is contingent upon the grant acceptance CAM #21-1054.

The South Redundant Sewer Force Main Project is substantially complete and is in the process of contract close out. Funding is recommended to be transferred from the South Redundant Sewer Force Main Project to the North Redundant Sewer Force Main Project.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 - 2026 Community Investment Plan (CIP) in the amount of \$500,259.08 to facilitate the additional scope of work for the North Redundant Sewer Force Main Project.

K. Appropriation of Grant Funds – Airport - Operations Fund – American Rescue Plan Act - \$148,000

The American Rescue Grant Program (ARGP) under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) has provided grant funding for costs related to cleaning, sanitization, janitorial services, and air purification devices aimed at combating the spread of pathogens at FXE.

Funds provided under the grant will be governed by the same principles that govern airport revenue. New airport development projects may not be funded with the described grant, unless and until the grant agreement is amended or superseded by a subsequent

agreement that addresses and authorizes the use of funds for the airport development project.

At its meeting of August 26, 2021, the Aviation Advisory Board supported staff's recommendation to accept this grant. Staff recommends the ARPA Grant Agreement be approved for the City to accept \$148,000 from the FAA for the prevention, preparation, and response to the Coronavirus.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 Operating Budget in the amount of \$148,000 for the acceptance of the American Rescue Plan Act Airport grant. This item is contingent upon the approval of the grant acceptance CAM #21-0851.

L. Transfer between Funds, Appropriation from Fund Balance – Central City Redevelopment Area Fund, Central City CRA Business Incentives Fund, General Fund – Central City Operating Expenses and Business Incentives for FY 2021 and FY 2022 – \$666,807

Subsection 163.387(7), Florida Statutes (2021), which governs Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) trust funds, provides that, "[o]n the last day of the fiscal year of the community redevelopment agency, any money which remains in the trust fund after payment of expenses . . . " be returned to each taxing authority which paid the increment in the proportion that the amount of the payment of such taxing authority bears to the total amount paid into the trust fund by all taxing authorities for that year, used to reduce the amount of any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged, deposited into an escrow account for the purpose of later reducing any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged, or appropriated to a specific redevelopment project pursuant to an approved community redevelopment plan.

Since the City of Fort Lauderdale is the sole taxing authority contributing Tax Increment Financing (TIF) to the Central City Area, staff recommends returning the anticipated unspent

funds from FY 2021 in the amount of \$666,807 to the City for reallocation back to the Central City Area to further goals and objectives of the Central City Redevelopment Plan.

Staff recommends appropriating \$516,807 to fund a Property and Business Investment Program. The balance of \$150,000 is recommended to be allocated to fund the rezoning and master plan effort in the Central City Area.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2022 Operating Budget in the amount of \$666,807 to re-appropriate FY 2021 year-end balances within the Central City CRA. There is an associated CRA CAM 21-1134.

M. Appropriation of Escrow Account Funds and Transfer between Capital Projects – Aquatic Complex Donations Escrow Account, Central Beach Fund - Aquatics Complex Renovations - \$413,676.87

Abandoning the Central Beach Wayfinding & Information Signage Project.

The Parks and Recreation Department is recommending that the City Commission approve the purchase of the ChlorKing Nexgen 100-SM-R On-Site Chlorine Generating System at \$413,676.87 for the Fort Lauderdale Aquatic Center. The system will allow the Aquatic Center pools to meet the specified chlorine disinfection requirements. The system will reduce chemical costs and reduce the need to store hazardous chemicals on site. Funding to support this project is recommended to come from the abandonment of the Central Beach Wayfinding & Information Signage Project.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2022 – FY 2026 Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$413,676.87 for the Aquatics Complex Renovations project. There are two associated CAMs: # 21-0979 and #21-1166.

N. Appropriation of Unanticipated Revenue and Expense – General Fund – Financial Analysis Services related to One Stop Shop Proposals - \$65,000

On June 19, 2020, the City received an unsolicited proposal from One Stop Shop, LLC ("Proposer") pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 255.065, to construct a recreational and cultural facility. At the October 6, 2020, City Commission Meeting, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 20-190 determining that the unsolicited proposal submitted by the Proposer serves a public purpose as a recreational and cultural facility, and as proposed it constituted a qualifying project pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 255.065.

In November 2021, the City reached agreement with Ernst and Young Infrastructure Advisors, LLC, ("EYIA"), to provide the financial analysis of the proposal for a fee of \$65,000. All expenditures are funded by amounts collected from the proposer.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the General Fund Operating Budget in the amount of \$65,000 to appropriate the unanticipated revenue and expense associated with this unsolicited proposal.

O. Transfer of Unused Grant Match Funds – Grant Fund, General Fund – Community Court Grant Match - \$10,002.61

In 2018 the Center for Court Innovation, Inc, in partnership with the Department of Justice, awarded \$200,000 to the City of Fort Lauderdale to implement a Community Court Pilot Program. The City volunteered a local match of \$30,000 from the General Fund to support the administrative costs of the program that exceeded the allowable grant reimbursement. The Neighbor Support Division utilized \$178,726.66 of the grant funding and \$19,997.39 of the general fund grant match. There is \$10,002.61 remaining in the unused grant match that should be returned to the General Fund.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY2022 Operating Budget in the amount of \$10,002.61 to return the unused grant match to the General Fund.
