TITLE: Motion Approving Negotiated Fee Schedule and Continuing Contracts for

Survey and Mapping Consulting Services - Various Consultants -

\$600,000 - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the ranking of firms and award two-year continuing contracts, in substantially the forms attached, for survey and mapping consulting services with the top three ranked firms: Craven, Thompson & Associates, Inc.; Woolpert, Inc.; and, Wantman Group, Inc.; in the estimated aggregate, two-year amount of \$600,000. This amount is to be distributed among the consultants following the normal task order approval process. Staff also requests approval for the City Manager to approve two, one-year renewal options contingent upon appropriation of funds.

## **Background**

The City of Fort Lauderdale solicited consulting engineering firms to provide survey and mapping consulting services for projects throughout the city, including but not limited to, construction layout, boundary surveys, preparation of sketches and legal descriptions, mapping, AutoCAD drafting, calculations and other survey and mapping related services.

The timeline of the solicitation process includes the following:

- January 3, 2019 Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") No. 12233-196 was issued for Survey and Mapping Consulting Services, continuing contract.
- February 6, 2019 The RFQ closed with a total of 12 firms submitting proposals. Three of the 12 vendors that responded are either a Minority-Owned Business Enterprise, Women-Owned Business Enterprise, or Small Business Enterprise.
- March 28, 2019 The Evaluation Committee ("Committee") met to evaluate the proposals. The firms were ranked based on the evaluation criteria shown in the

table below. The top six firms selected for presentations were Craven Thompson & Associates, Inc., F.R Aleman, Keith & Associates, Inc., Keith & Schnars, Wantman Group, Inc. and Woolpert Inc.

 May 2 and 3, 2019 – The Committee met to evaluate the presentations of the six selected firms. The firms' presentations were ranked based on the evaluation criteria shown in the table above and, after careful consideration, the Committee decided to select three firms.

The Committee has reviewed the submissions and presentations from each vendor and determined that the selected consultants listed below meet the criteria specified in the published RFQ. Negotiations with the three firms have been completed and staff recommends contract award to the three consultants at the hourly rates identified in Exhibit B of the respective contracts.
