TITLE: Motion to approve a purchase of recycled dual waste and recycling
receptacles – Contract CNR01334 - \$336,105

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a purchase for 350 recycled dual waste and recycling receptacles from The Prestwick Group, Inc., d/b/a Max-R, in the amount of \$336,105 in accordance with Public Sourcing Solution Cooperative contract CNR01334, in conjunction with the University of Wisconsin acting as lead agency.

Background

On November 13, 2012, the City of Fort Lauderdale accepted a grant from Broward County Resource Recovery Board which included a \$735,000 appropriation for the expansion of public space recycling.

Parks and Recreation established a goal to increase recycling in parks and to reduce the number of can styles used throughout the City. Rather than two separate containers that add to the footprint required, and sets that often become unpaired, a single round dual waste and recycling unit was chosen. Made from 97% recycled plastic, the unit meets Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Certification requirements and is sustainable. Hinged doors eliminate overhead lifting of the liners from the body and educational graphics provide aesthetics as well as “point of use” instructions.

The dual waste can will replace current waste containers in the following parks: George English Park, Jack Kaye Park, Carter Park, Lauderdale Manors Park, South Middle River Park, Mills Pond Park, Osswald Park, Croissant Park, Floyd Hull Stadium, Hott Park and Riverland Park.

Cans currently in these parks will be retrofitted as recycling containers and placed next to a matching waste container in another park until such time that new containers are required.

Pursuant to the Code of Ordinances, Section 2-181(7), Waiver of formal bid requirements, this purchase of recycled dual waste and recycling receptacles will be made utilizing Public Sourcing Solution Cooperative Contract CNR01334 to The Prestwick Group, Inc., d/b/a Max-R, in the amount of \$336,105.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City. Purchase is funded through the Resource Recovery Board Grant.
