TITLE: Public Hearing - Resolution Approving the Transfer of the City-Owned

Property Located at 800 NW 22 Road in the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights Community Redevelopment Area to the Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency, Pursuant to Section 8.02 of the

Charter of the City of Fort Lauderdale - (Commission District 3)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission accept a resolution approving the transfer of Cityowned property located at 800 NW 22 Road within the Northwest-Progresso-Flagler Heights Community Redevelopment Area ("NPF CRA") to the Fort Lauderdale Community Redevelopment Agency ("CRA").

Background

As stipulated in Section 8.02 of the City Charter, the City is authorized to convey real property it owns to another public entity for a public purpose that serves the public interest. This item involves the transfer of 800 NW 22 Road, Folio# 504205080080, to the Fort Lauderdale CRA. This action aims to address and mitigate slum conditions and blight, as well as to encourage the introduction of new businesses within the area. The property in question, situated in the NPF CRA (Exhibit 1), is valued at \$650,000 (Exhibit 2), and is zoned as Residential Multifamily Mid Rise/Medium High Density (RMM-25).

On February 6, 2024, the City Commission adopted Resolution 24-35 (Exhibit 3) declaring its intent to convey one (1) City-owned property to the CRA. To effectuate the transfer of the property from the City to the CRA, the Commission must adopt a resolution declaring its acceptance to convey the property to the CRA.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this item.
