TITLE: Motion Authorizing Professional Services for Central Beach Alliance Pump Station Replacement and Sewer Redirection – Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. – \$179,992

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order No. 4 with Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc. for pump station and sanitary sewer design services in the amount of \$179,992 (Exhibit 1).

Background

This Project involves the design of a new pump station (D-41) on North Birch Road between Riomar Street and Bayshore Drive, abandonment of existing pump station, and redirection of a portion of the sanitary sewer collection system. The existing pump station is approaching the end of its design life and is in need of improvements. In addition, due to future developments in the area, a new pump station with greater capacity is required.

This Task Order is being entered into pursuant to the continuing contract for civil engineering consultant services (Contract 626-10881) with Calvin, Giordano & Associates, Inc., in accordance with the terms of the amended master agreement dated November 6, 2012 (CAR #12-2299) and renewed on October 21, 2014 (CAM #14-1066).

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$179,992 for the Task Order and \$17,999 for in house project management fees, for a total of \$197,991.
