TITLE: Motion approving the First Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement

between Broward County for cost sharing in the development of a saltwater intrusion model for the central portion of coastal Broward County

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the first Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with Broward County for cost sharing in the development of a saltwater intrusion model for the central portion of coastal Broward County, extending the term of the agreement to April 13, 2015 to provide additional time to finalize the model and incorporate the model into the Northern and Southern models.

Background

On April 13, 2010 the City Commission executed the original agreement with Broward County to develop a saltwater model for the central region of Broward County through the United States Geological Survey (USGS). This project benefits and protects the City's water supply as the model can predict the saltwater interface (i.e. during drought conditions) and provide the City with relevant information that may impact operations. This project also supports Broward County's Integrated Water Resource Plan (IWRP), and the South Florida Water Management District's (SFWMD) Lower East Coast (LEC) Regional Water Supply Plan, as well as the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan (CERP).

The request for an amendment is to allow more time to perform quality assurance and quality control on the model prior to acceptance by the County. In addition, the County is integrating the northern and southern models with the central model to obtain a complete model of the County's saltwater interface.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City associated with this action. This amendment modifies the final payment schedule previously approved by the City Commission on February 2, 2010, CAR 10-0083.
