

ORDINANCE NO. C-13-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES OF THE FOUR CITY COMMISSION DISTRICTS SO THAT SUCH DISTRICTS SHALL BE AS APPROXIMATELY EQUAL IN POPULATION AS IS PRACTICABLE PURSUANT TO SECTION 7.12 OF THE CITY CHARTER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, City Charter Section 7.12 provides that after the receipt of the published information of each decennial census, the City Commission shall reestablish the boundaries of the four commission districts so that the districts shall be as approximately equal in population as is practicable; and

WHEREAS, the City has received the results of the 2010 decennial census; and

WHEREAS, the City's next regular municipal primary election will be held on March 10, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to reestablish the boundaries of the four commission districts so that the districts shall be as approximately equal in population as is practicable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Section 7.12 of the City Charter of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the boundaries of the four geographical commission districts are reestablished as described and depicted upon the City Commission District Map which is attached hereto as "Exhibit A", incorporated herein, and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. That if any clause, section or other part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not

be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days from the date of final passage.

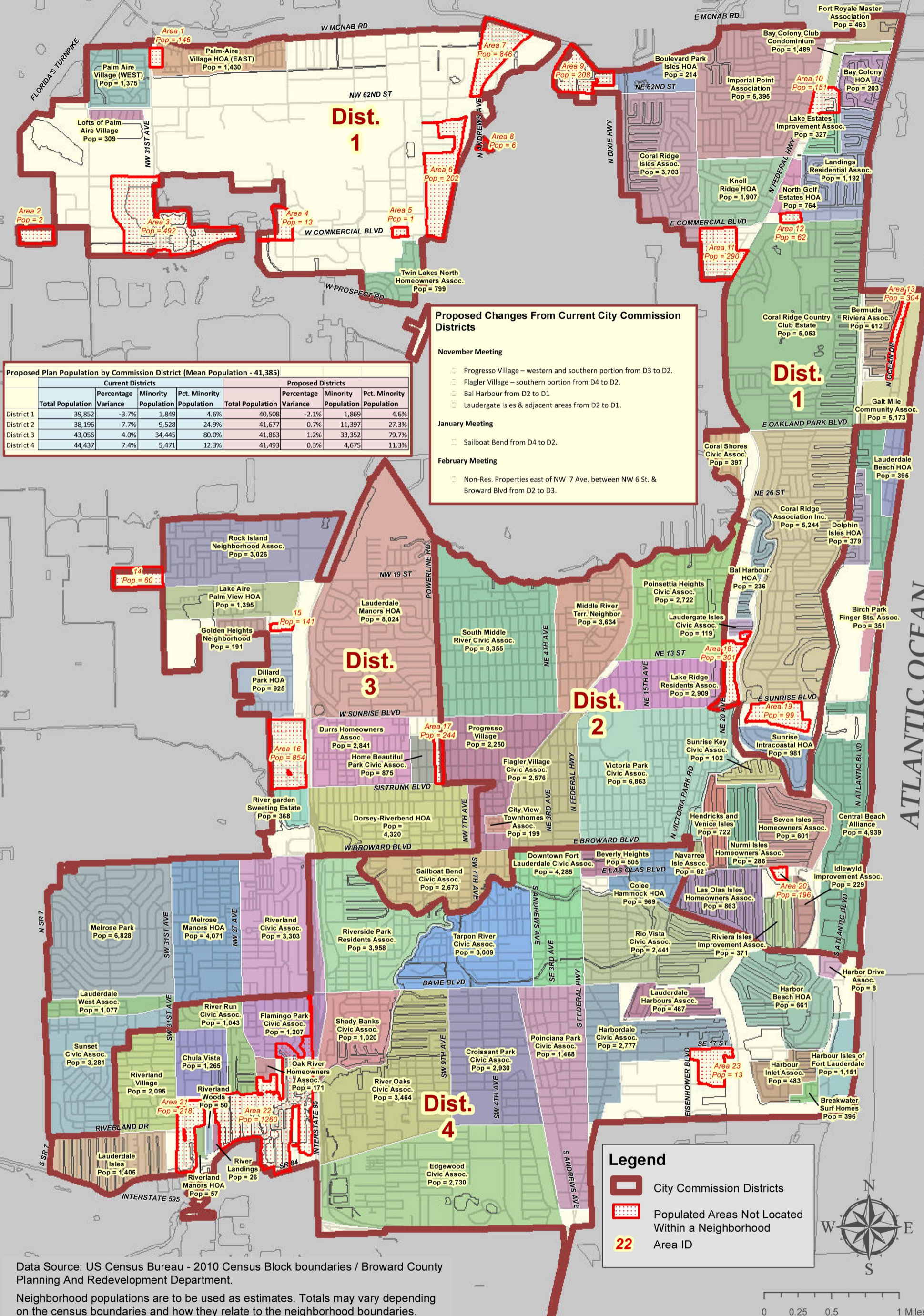
