TITLE: Motion Accepting Grant from the United States Department of

Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency FY19 Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the Amount of \$1,074,072 -

(Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission accept a grant from the United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in the amount of \$1,074,072.

### **Background**

In February 2020, the Fire Rescue Department applied for funds through the USDHS/FEMA, Assistance to Firefighters Grant, whose purpose is to provide funds to National, State, Local, or Community organizations recognized for their experience and expertise with respect to Fire Prevention or Firefighter safety programs and activities.

On July 31, 2020, the Department was notified its funding application for a NFPA 1583 compliant Fitness/Wellness and Injury Reduction Training Program was approved.

The Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue Department (FLFR) requested grant funds to implement a long, sought-after NFPA 1583 compliant Fitness/Wellness and Injury Reduction Training Program for all sworn members of FLFR. All facets of the program will focus on building a workforce that is physically, mentally, and emotionally resilient to safely and will efficiently accomplish the overall mission of FLFR.

Following consultation with representatives from other fire rescue departments, who have implemented like workshops and with associated vendors, the grant will allow for twelve (12) workshops offered in three (3) series, with the duration of each workshop being eight (8) hours. The series will cover physical fitness, nutrition, behavioral health/stress management, mental performance, injury prevention, and sleep management, and will be taught by experts in their respective fields. It is anticipated each workshop will be attended by 35 personnel as follows:

- Series 1 Day 1 Curriculum 12 days (8-hrs./day) with 35/day
- Series 2 Day 2 Curriculum 12 days (8-hrs./day) with 35/day
- Series 3 Day 3 Curriculum 12 days (8-hrs./day) with 35/day

Additionally, there will be individual movement screenings that identify and highlight the individual's predisposition to injuries. Following the screenings, comprehensive exercise guides will be provided to everyone to mitigate the injury risks. This will also include a sustainability platform (on-line application) for members to develop individual workout plans, view proper form to utilize for various exercises, retrieve healthy recipes and daily workouts, as well as on-line access to health and wellness experts to address personal questions.

Furthermore, grant funds will cover overtime costs for operations' personnel to attend the twelve workshops offered in three (3) sessions, with the duration of each workshop being eight (8) hours; overtime backfills for mandatory, minimum-staffed operational positions.

The successful implementation of a comprehensive health and wellness program has proven to reduce injuries, their associated costs, and employee sick leave usage in other jurisdictions across the country.

The City of Fort Lauderdale has been awarded \$976,429.09 from the USDHS/FEMA with a \$97,642.91 (10% local cash match).

## Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$976,429.09 and a local cash match in the amount of \$97,642.91. Funds are being appropriated through companion agenda item, CAM #20-0094.
