

Dear Honorable Mayor and City Commissioners,

As you know the Vintro Hotel is scheduled to come before the City Commission on September 3, 2013 for approval of a Level IV site plan.

The Vintro Hotel is proposed to be a massive glass and white stucco box sitting on a small 12,000 square foot lot in the middle of Alhambra Street, in the Central Beach neighborhood of the City of Ft. Lauderdale.

This project is not a good fit for the neighborhood. It's incompatible with the existing development pattern in the community. It's architecture does not reference its surroundings.

While hotels may be permitted in the neighborhood, the Central Beach Master Plan and the City's land development regulations contemplated resort-style hotels with lush landscaping and wide setbacks creating beautiful vistas and preserving open spaces. The Vintro Hotel, as proposed, would be jammed onto a postage stamp size parcel.

Furthermore, the Vintro Hotel would have detrimental impacts on the functioning of Alhambra Street for existing businesses and residents. The Vintro Hotel does not accommodate its parking and loading on its site, and at high peak times and during special events, the stacking of cars would create a safety hazard and traffic nightmare.

The Central Beach Alliance voted unanimously to oppose this project. The Planning and Zoning Board recommended denial.
