- TITLE: Motion Approving an Amended and Restated Agreement between Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale for SWIM Central Water Safety Instruction and Education at Bass Park Pool, Carter Park Pool, Croissant Park Pool, Lauderdale Manors Park Pool, and Riverland Park Pool – (Commission Districts 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve an Amended and Restated Agreement between Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale for SWIM Central Water Safety Instruction and Education, in substantially the form attached, and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale and Broward County entered into an agreement in 2016 for water safety education and instruction services. The agreement authorizes the City to provide water safety instruction and education classes for children and adults as part of the SWIM Central program, on a reimbursement basis per the defined fee schedule, up to \$50,000 per year.

SWIM Central is the coordinating agency for water safety instruction and discount swim lesson coupons in Broward County. Since the inception of SWIM Central in 1999, parents and guardians have enrolled more than 700,000 children in SWIM Central water-safety programs, and more than 20,000 discount coupons for swim lessons have been distributed. The current rate for learning to swim for residents is \$64.00 for eight 30-minute classes (Parent and Toddler through Level 2) or \$80.00 for eight 45-minute classes (Level 3, Level 4 and Adult).

Broward County and the City of Fort Lauderdale have partnered together for the past 20 years to provide water safety instruction and education classes for children enrolled in the Broward County Public School District. The swimming lessons are designed to assist with decreasing the number of drownings in Broward County. Broward County Public School children are bussed or walk to the pool (if adjacent to a park) during school hours between 9:00am - 1:00pm. Classes are conducted for HeadStart, Pre-Kindergarten, Kindergarten

and Exceptional Student Education (ESE) programs. Parents and/or guardians must sign waivers prior to their child attending the swimming lessons.

In addition, SWIM Central's curriculum-based programs provide ten free 30-minute watersafety classes during the school day over a two-week period, taught by certified watersafety instructors provided by the Parks and Recreation Department. These services are provided at several locations, including Croissant Park Pool, Riverland Park Pool, Bass Park Pool, Lauderdale Manors Park Pool, and Carter Park Pool. The classes have a strong emphasis on water safety education, swim development, and how to recognize aquatic emergencies. In 2023-24, the City of Fort Lauderdale provided approximately 700 children with water safety education and instruction that led to approximately \$16,100.00 in reimbursements.

In October 2024, Broward County notified the City of Fort Lauderdale that the reimbursement rates for SWIM Central would be increasing effective October 1, 2024. Broward County negotiated new agreement terms with all contracted vendors to establish a term period from October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025, with four (4) additional automatic one (1)-year term extensions, subject to the same rates, terms, and conditions as the original Agreement. The intent of the proposed amended and restated agreement is to memorialize the term, reimbursement rate increases, and the annual maximum reimbursement amount, which took effect at the start of this fiscal year, and other general terms and conditions.

Pursuant to the proposed agreement, the Parks and Recreation Department has the authority to modify service locations, add, and remove sites with prior written notice to the contractor. However, adding new locations does not change the maximum reimbursement amount of \$100,000 per fiscal year. If approved, the City will invoice SWIM Central at the end of the session for instruction classes administered pursuant to the terms of the agreement outlined below:
