TITLE: Grant Agreement with Broward County for one Mass Casualty Incident
Bag

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission authorize the City Manager to accept equipment from the Town of Davie via the Broward County Office of Medical Examiner and to execute any documents required to accept one (1) mass casualty incident bag.

Background

The State of Florida, Department of Health, Bureau of Emergency Medical Services through Broward County Office of Medical Examiner and Trauma Services has sub-granted the FY 2013 Broward County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Grant Program to the Town of Davie to provide funds to address EMS equipment, training and other needs.

In accordance with the Broward County FY 2013 EMS Grant Program, the City of Fort Lauderdale was added to a resolution in the Town of Davie and Broward County and will uphold the terms and conditions Memoranda of Agreement (MOA) which identifies the distribution of equipment by the Town of Davie which specifies maintenance and inventory responsibilities in accordance with Broward County EMS Grant Program policies.

The City of Fort Lauderdale will accept the following item:

One (1) – Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) bag - \$421.00
