TITLE: MOTION – Approving an Appropriation from the Beach Community

Redevelopment Agency's (CRA) Undesignated Balance of \$436,878 and a transfer of \$38,601 from State Road A1A Beachfront Promenade to Fund the Design and Implementation of the Fort Lauderdale Beach Streetscape Improvement Project (Almond Avenue / SR A1A Streetscape

Improvements).

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the Community Redevelopment Agency Board of Directors pass a motion authorizing an appropriation from the Beach CRA's Undesignated Fund Balance and a transfer from State Road A1A Beachfront Promenade project to fund the design and implementation of the Fort Lauderdale Beach Improvement Project, located within the Beach CRA boundaries.

# **Background**

On September 17, 2013 the City Commission selected the top-ranked proposer Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for design and implementation of the Fort Lauderdale Beach Streetscape Improvement Project (Almond Avenue and SR A1A).

At the September 23, 2013 Joint City Commission / Beach Redevelopment Advisory Board workshop, the City Commission directed staff to include the same improvements to the East side of SR A1A as are proposed on the West side of SR A1A. These improvements include installing new pavers and relocating sidewalk impediments (trees, signs, poles, lights etc.) to the curb line, thus creating a clear path for pedestrians and providing a buffer between pedestrians and vehicular traffic. Also included in the SR A1A Streetscape improvements are the proposed restroom facilities on the West side of SR A1A, immediately East of the Sebastian Street Parking Lot. Funding for design and implementation has not been identified for that portion of SR A1A outside the Beach CRA boundaries. When funding is identified, a task order for that portion SR A1A will be submitted to the City Commission for approval.

The direction given for the Almond Avenue Streetscape improvements was to provide quality improvements, but to scale back the proposal to realize cost savings that could be applied to other projects.
