

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission consider approving a Fourth Amendment to the Comprehensive Agreement with Las Olas Parking Solutions, LLC for the Development, Operation, and Maintenance of a Multi-Use Structure with Public Parking, a Fire-Rescue/EMS Substation, and Retail, at the Southeast Corner of SE 2nd Court and SE 8th Avenue.

Background

On June 24, 2021, the City received an unsolicited proposal pursuant to Section 255.065, Florida Statutes, to develop, operate, and maintain a multi-use structure with public parking, a Fire Rescue/EMS Substation, and retail, at the site of an existing City parking lot located at the southeast corner of SE 2nd Court and SE 8th Avenue. The proposer submitted the required application fee of \$25,000 in accordance with Resolution No. 13-187.

On November 16, 2021, through Resolution No. 21-261, the City Commission determined that the proposed project would serve a public purpose as a vehicle parking facility and a public facility or infrastructure that is used and will be used by the public at large or in support of an accepted public purpose or activity, and constitutes a qualifying project pursuant to Section 255.065, Florida Statutes. In accordance with the foregoing statute, the City advertised and accepted other proposals for the same project in accordance with Section 255.065, Florida Statutes, for a period of thirty (30) days after the initial date of publication, up through and including 5:00 PM, December 22, 2021. The City did not receive any proposed competing proposals during the aforementioned timeframe.

On May 3, 2022, through Resolution No. 22-94, the City Commission authorized the City Manager to negotiate a proposed Interim and/or Comprehensive Agreement, in

Accordance with Section 255.065, Florida Statutes.

The City Commission approved the Comprehensive Agreement on July 5, 2023. Subsequently, there have been two amendments executed to extend the Inspection Period. The First Amendment was approved on November 7, 2023, and the Second Amendment was approved on January 23, 2024 and the Third Amendment was approved on March 5, 2024. The Fourth Amendment will extend the Inspection Period to July 5, 2024 to provide additional time to finalize the real estate and infrastructure considerations.

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO COMPREHENSIVE AGREEMENT

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT TO COMPREHENSIVE AGREEMENT ("Amendment") dated the 17 day Aug., 2024 by and between the City of Fort Lauderdale, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida ("City"), and Las Olas Parking Solutions, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, its successors and assigns ("Private Party" together with the City are collectively "Parties" and individually "Party").

WHEREAS, the City and the Private Party entered into that certain Comprehensive Agreement dated as of July 31, 2023, as amended ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement to extend the Inspection Period to a period from the Effective Dave until the end of October 3, 2024.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants exchanged herein and in consideration of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, adequacy and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The recitations heretofore set forth are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference. The Agreement as modified by this Fourth Amendment remains in full force and effect. To the extent of any inconsistency between the terms of this Fourth Amendment and the terms of the Agreement, the terms of this Fourth Amendment shall supersede and control to the extent of such inconsistency. Terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning set forth in the Agreement.
- 2. The definition of Inspection Period is hereby amended to be the period from the Effective Date until the end of October 3, 2024.
- 3. Duplicate originals of this Fourth Amendment may be executed and each of such original shall be deemed to be an original Fourth Amendment. This Fourth Amendment may be executed by electronic signature which shall be deemed an original signature of each such party.
