Intersection Modifications Project - Weekley Asphalt Inc. - \$123,317.00 -  
**(Commission District 2)**

**Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve an agreement, in substantially the form attached, with Weekley Asphalt Inc., for Las Olas Blvd and SE 15<sup>th</sup> Ave Intersection Modifications Project, in the amount of \$123,317.00.

**Background**

In December 2022, Marlin Engineering completed the design to modify the vehicular traffic movement patterns at the intersection E. Las Olas Blvd and SE 15<sup>th</sup> Ave. This project consists of converting the southbound right through traffic lane along SE 15 Ave to a tri-movement (right-through-left) lane. This will convert the southbound movement from a single left turn to dual left turn. The project involves milling and resurfacing for re-striping purposes, signing and pavement marking modifications, and signal modifications to the existing strain-wire structures.

On May 16, 2023, the Procurement Division advertised ITB Event No. 88-4 for Las Olas Blvd and SE 15th Intersection Modifications. The City received three bids on June 26, 2023 as follows:

- Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc - \$123,317.00
- FG Construction LLC - \$172,155.85
- Florida Blacktop, Inc. - \$173,794.74

None of the firms claimed a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise status. All three firms were reviewed for compliance with the solicitation requirements. Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc met all the solicitation requirements of the ITB and was deemed the low responsive, and responsible bidder.

**Resource Impact**

There will be an impact to the City in the amount of \$123,317.00. Funds for the crosswalk construction are available in the FY 2023 Community Investment Plan in the account

listed below.
