Thanks for the clarification and all of your help throughout this process!

Unfortunately, awarding these vendors by line items is not going to work because the way we intended for this to be set up is to have various options for our law enforcement agencies to pick one from of these vendor labs to work their case based on the needs of their case. Each case is different and some cases may require more than just one line item. The last thing we need is to bounce these cases around to different vendors when one vendor can bundle those services together, and usually at a discounted rate.

I apologize for the miscommunication but I just spoke to both Gretchen and Jennifer and that has been our intent and understanding all along from our end.

We would prefer to have all of these labs under contract for all of the services that they can provide at the rates that they have indicated and then we can offer those options to our law enforcement agencies to decide which lab they want to send their case to based on the needs of their case. I apologize for the delayed response, was waiting to get back some information from our agent relative to the policy requirements you outlined below.

ADDENDUM 2

Y-STR PROFILE COMPARISON SERVICES

Since 2000 when direct-to-consumer DNA testing companies were founded to provide low cost DNA testing to genealogists, Y-DNA testing has been of high interest to that community because it is handed down along the male line of the family along with the family name. Y-DNA testing has proven especially beneficial to male adoptees - a match found in the Y-DNA genealogy databases can indicate the surname of an adoptee's birth father. Likewise, comparing an unknown Y-profile from a cold case to the genetic genealogy Y-DNA databases may produce a last name for a suspect.

There are about 250k genetic genealogy Y-DNA profiles posted online, grouped into perhaps 5,000 or more large and small publicdatabases. Identifinders has developed software that can mine most of the largest for matches to forensic Y-STR profiles. A match may indicate a last name associated with that profile. Even without a name match, a Y-STR profile can indicate ethnic background or haplogroup (Caucasian, African America, Native America...), and sometimes a nationality. For the 1992-1993 Phoenix Canal Murders, we were able to produce a match for the Y-profile developed from crime scene DNA to a group of genealogical profiles associated with the name Miller. The list of approximately 2,000 suspects only included five Millers. This led to the arrest of Phoenix resident Bryan Patrick Miller.

As indicated by Table 1, a large fraction of the 132 Y-STR profiles we have analyzed have been Caucasian European. Cold case work benefits from Y-STR analysis because this is the ethnicity of most genetic genealogists whose data is included in the databases used for comparison. It is more difficult to find name matches to African Americans and Native Americans, but knowing that a perpetrator is one of these ethnicities can still be considered an investigative lead.

Of the total of 132 cases, ten were analyzed for haplogroup only. The results of name searches on the remaining 122 are indicated in Table 2. The results of analyzing just the 102 Caucasian

European cases are shown in Table 3. Note that one, two, and three matching names are group

DNA TESTING FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENCE

1.0 **INTENT**

Maricopa County (County) is seeking qualified vendors that can provide deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) testing of sexual assault evidence for multiple agencies. The scope of the project primarily includes Y-screening and autosomal Short Tandem Repeat (STR) testing of sexual assault kit evidence in the form of untested and/or pre-screened sexual assault kits. Upon request, the County may seek advanced DNA testing on individual evidence samples including:

- Y-STR analysis (Short Tandem Repeat on the Y-chromosome)
- Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) analysis
- SNP testing and Forensic Genealogy research
- DNA Phenotyping

Maricopa County reserves the right to award this contract to multiple vendors. The County reserves the right to award in whole or in part, by item or group of items, by section or geographic area, or make multiple awards, where such action serves the County's best interest.

Other governmental entities under agreement with the County may have access to services provided hereunder (see also Sections 3.10 and 3.11, below).

The County reserves the right to add additional contractors, at the County's sole discretion, in cases where the currently listed contractors are of an insufficient number or skill-set to satisfy the County's needs.

2.0 **SPECIFICATIONS**

2.1 Contractor Minimum Qualification (Minimum Qualifications do not apply to sections 2.6 Part C - Forensic Genealogy or 2.7 Part D - DNA Phenotyping below.)

- 2.1.1 Must be accredited to International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 17025 standard by ANSI National Accreditation Board (ANAB) or the American Association for Laboratory Accreditation (A2LA).
- 2.1.2 Must undergo annual Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) QAS (Quality Assurance Standards) audits.
- 2.1.3 Must demonstrate NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act) compliance.
- 2.1.4 Contractor lab technical procedures must include the following:
 - 2.1.4.1 Commercial 24-locus forensic STR DNA amplifications kits:
 - 2.1.4.1.1 Globalfiler[™] PCR Amplification Kit, Powerplex[®] Fusion 6C System and Investigator 24plex.
 - 2.1.4.2 Commercial Y-STR amplification kit must be approved by each Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) laboratory (see Exhibit 2).
 - 2.1.4.3 3100 or 3500 series capillary electrophoresis instrumentation.
 - 2.1.4.4 Genemapper® ID-X data analysis software version 1.5 or higher.
- 2.1.5 Must demonstrate five years of forensic experience in processing sexual assault kits and the ability to interpret complex DNA mixtures.
- 2.1.6 The laboratory DNA analyst or DNA technical leader assigned to the project must have three years of DNA experience processing sexual assault evidence.

- 2.1.7 All testing must be completed within 60 days from receipt of evidence.
- 2.2 General Laboratory Practices
 - 2.2.1 Contractor must send all updated technical procedures to the CODIS laboratories listed in Exhibit 2 within seven (7) days of the approved updates.
 - 2.2.2 Contractor must maintain the chain-of-custody.
 - 2.2.2.1 Contractor shall provide chain-of-custody forms within the case file prior to the completion of the report.
 - 2.2.3 All evidence samples shall be delivered to Contractor by an Agency or Agency Crime Lab via a shipping carrier with tracking number, such as UPS or FedEx.
 - 2.2.4 Contractor must document condition of evidence received, e.g. sealed, as part of the permanent case file.
 - 2.2.5 All vaginal aspirates or other liquid items in kit will be refrigerated and the remaining non-liquid items in the kit can be stored at room temperature.
 - 2.2.6 Contractor must seal and initial all evidence before return.
 - 2.2.7 Notes must be maintained regarding evidence tested and results. An electronic copy of the notes shall be provided via secure site/portal or equivalent.
 - 2.2.8 Reports and DNA data files will be delivered electronically via secure site, portal or equivalent. All reports may be issued in batch format.
 - 2.2.9 Contractor shall overnight all extracted DNA samples and the evidence samples with ice packs/dry ice to the submitting agency.

2.3 Technical Specifications

- 2.3.1 Y Screening
 - 2.3.1.1 Male quantitation thresholds must be validated and submitted to each CODIS laboratory for approval prior to the initiation of casework.
 - 2.3.1.2 For values below the validated threshold, testing may be stopped and a report will be issued to the Agency Crime Lab indicating that no male DNA or the quantity of male DNA detected is unsuitable for further testing.

2.3.2 Extracting

- 2.3.2.1 DNA IQ or a Qiagen based extractions will be utilized, unless otherwise approved by the respective CODIS lab.
- 2.3.2.2 All extraction blanks/negative controls will be eluted in the same volume as the lowest elution sample volume in the batch.
- 2.3.2.3 At least two (2) extraction blanks will be run per batch of unknown sample extractions.
- 2.3.3 Quantitation
 - 2.3.3.1 The Quantifiler® Trio or PowerQuant kits will be utilized and analyzed on the AB 7000 or 7500, unless otherwise approved by the respective CODIS lab.

- 2.3.3.2 Quantitation thresholds must be validated and submitted to each CODIS laboratory for approval prior to the initiation of casework.
- 2.3.3.3 For values below the validated threshold, testing may be stopped and a report will be issued via a secured portal, as part of the case file, indicating that no DNA or the quantity of DNA detected is unsuitable for amplification.
- 2.3.3.4 Full reactions must be utilized, unless otherwise approved by each respective CODIS lab.
- 2.3.3.5 The R² values and slope ranges for the chosen quantitation method must meet the Contractor laboratory's validated specifications.
- 2.3.4 Amplification
 - 2.3.4.1 Forensic samples will be amplified using Globalfiler[™] PCR Amplification Kit, Powerplex® Fusion 6C System and Investigator 24plex with manufacturer recommended reaction volumes. Any other reaction volumes will require CODIS lab approval.
 - 2.3.4.2 Extraction blanks will be amplified at the most sensitive concentration, which is dictated by the forensic sample containing the least amount of DNA. Any blanks resulting in a quantitation value must be amplified and analyzed.
 - 2.3.4.3 If re-amplification is required at a more sensitive concentration (e.g. increasing the amount of DNA being amplified) the same conditions must also be applied to one of its corresponding extraction blanks.
- 2.3.5 Capillary Electrophoresis
 - 2.3.5.1 An Applied Biosystem® (AB) 3100 or 3500 series Genetic Analyzer will be utilized.
 - 2.3.5.2 Allele sizes and designations shall be determined with an appropriate internal lane standard and allelic ladder which represents all the common alleles for that particular locus.
 - 2.3.5.3 At least one allelic ladder and at least one positive amplification control must size correctly during the electrophoresis for the associated data to be reported.
 - 2.3.5.4 All negative controls and extraction blanks will be injected at the same time as the longest injection time for the samples associated with them.
- 2.3.6 Data Analysis and Interpretation
 - 2.3.6.1 Negative extraction controls (reagent blanks), negative amplification controls, and positive amplification controls must have the expected results for the associated data to be reported.
 - 2.3.6.1.1 The expected result for the positive amplification control will be consistent with the published STR or Y-STR profile for the amplification positive control, with all alleles above the validated analytical threshold.
 - 2.3.6.1.1.1 The expected results for reagent blanks and negative amplification controls are no allelic peaks above the validated analytical threshold.
 - 2.3.6.1.2 Resolution of a non-conforming result from a reagent blank should be attempted to be remedied through re-injection, re-setting up and re-running the sample or re-amplifying the sample at the Contractor's laboratory expense. If the non-conforming results persist, approval for additional laboratory work must be first given by the CODIS lab DNA Technical Leader.

- 2.3.6.1.3 If off-scale data interferes with interpretation, the sample must be rerun or re-amplified.
- 2.3.6.1.4 Virtual alleles assigned by the analysis software (Genemapper ID-X) do not have to be re-injected or re-amplified.
- 2.3.6.1.5 Samples that show an off-ladder allele (OLA) within the range of the ladder alleles or that have alleles lower or higher than the allelic ladder that are labeled "OL" by the software must be re-injected or rerun for verification unless the results are duplicated in another injection or another sample in the case.
- 2.3.6.1.6 Contractor shall provide to each CODIS lab the Contractor's validated interpretation guidelines used in the determination of alleles calls and report conclusions.
- 2.3.6.1.7 Mixture interpretation may utilize validated probabilistic genotyping software when appropriate. The respective CODIS lab Technical Leader must approve the use of the probabilistic genotyping software prior to use.
- 2.3.7 Reporting and Case file
 - 2.3.7.1 All biological screening and DNA findings, both negative and positive, as well as any items received, but not analyzed, will be documented in a report format agreed upon by the CODIS lab and the Contractor.
 - 2.3.7.2 Any assumptions made for interpretation or statistics, such as number of contributors and/or presence of possible contributors(s) must be denoted on report.
 - 2.3.7.3 For profiles where only some loci are used in the statistical calculations (such as partial profiles and mixtures), the number of loci utilized (or not utilized) in these calculations will be denoted on the report.
 - 2.3.7.4 The entirety of each case file including the signed report, all laboratory worksheets for all case samples and controls, administrative documents, chain-of-custody, correspondence, technical/administrative review, memos addressing non-conformance, electropherograms and raw data, shall be provided to the respective CODIS lab electronically. All documentation shall be properly labeled in accordance with accreditation criteria to permit a quality review to be conducted by CODIS lab personnel.
- 2.4 Part A Sexual Screening Analysis
 - 2.4.1 All swabs within the sexual assault kit will be Y screened:
 - 2.4.1.1 If the Y screening results are negative or unsuitable for further testing, analysis can be stopped and a negative report will be drafted and submitted via a secure portal.
 - 2.4.1.2 In single assailant cases where consensual sex has not occurred within five days of the assault, one evidence sample and one reference will proceed to DNA analysis.
 - 2.4.1.3 If there are multiple assailants, the victim was unconscious, there was consensual sex within five days of the assault or there is not a description of the assault, two evidence swabs and one reference sample (swab/blood blot or stain card) will proceed to DNA analysis.

- 2.4.1.4 Contractor will send electronic DNA case files and data directly to each individual laboratory.
- 2.5 Part B Advance DNA Testing Y-STR and mtDNA
 - 2.5.1 For individual cases identified by the CODIS laboratories, advanced testing may be required to determine the identity of the sample. If the evidence is degraded, of limited nature, of low percentage male DNA, or the nuclear STR test results are not sufficient, then additional tests (Y-STRs and/or mitochondrial tests) may be requested.
 - 2.5.2 Y-STR Testing
 - 2.5.2.1 Contractor shall have the capability of analyzing casework samples for Y-STR DNA analysis.
 - 2.5.2.2 Contractor must use a commercial Y-STR amplification kit that has been approved by the CODIS laboratory.
 - 2.5.2.3 Contractor shall provide the name of the specific kit with pricing on Attachment A- 1.
 - 2.5.2.4 Use of any reaction volumes outside of the commercial amplification kit manufacturer's recommendations will require DNA Technical Leader approval from the respective laboratory.
 - 2.5.3 mtDNA Testing
 - 2.5.3.1 If Contractor has the capability of analyzing casework samples for mtDNA sequencing, parentage testing, and kinship testing, contractor shall provide pricing on Attachment A-1.
- 2.6 Part C Forensic Genealogy
 - 2.6.1 For individual cases identified by Maricopa County, cases that do not result in a CODIS match, forensic genealogy may be requested.
 - 2.6.2 Forensic Genealogy:
 - 2.6.2.1 Contractor must utilize a proficient DNA analyst to review reported case files to determine the candidate samples for forensic genealogy testing.
 - 2.6.2.2 For samples that move forward for forensic genealogy testing, contractor shall:
 - 2.6.2.2.1 Communicate, work with and report directly to the respective CODIS laboratory.
 - 2.6.2.2.2 Deliver a report to the respective CODIS laboratory with a recommendation of whether or not to proceed with genealogical investigation.
 - 2.6.2.2.3 Deliver a report to the respective agency that includes a signed affidavit of the conclusions from the investigation, if proceeding with the genealogy testing.
 - 2.6.2.2.4 Perform STR confirmation testing of a new reference sample for direct comparison to the original STR profile generated from the evidence.

2.7 Part D - DNA Phenotyping

2.7.1 For individual cases identified by Maricopa County, cases that do not result in a CODIS match but a DNA profile exists, DNA phenotyping may be requested. If the Contractor lab is capable of conducting DNA phenotyping, contractor shall provide pricing for phenotyping on Attachment A-1.

3.0 PURCHASING REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Acceptance

Upon completion, services shall be deemed accepted and the warranty period shall begin. All documentation shall be completed prior to final acceptance.

3.2 Usage Report

The Contractor shall furnish the County a usage report upon request delineating the acquisition activity governed by the Contract. The format of the report shall be approved by the County and shall disclose the quantity and dollar value of each contract item by individual unit.

3.3 Background Check

Bidders/proposers need to be aware that there may be multiple background checks (Sheriff's Office, County Attorney's Office, and Courts, as well as Maricopa County general government) to determine if the respondent is acceptable to do business with the County. This applies to (but is not limited to) the company, subcontractors and employees and the failure to pass these checks shall deem the respondent non-responsible.

Bidders/proposers need to be aware that they may be required to pass multiple background checks (e.g. Sheriff's Office, County Attorney's Office, Courts, as well as County general government) to determine if the respondent is acceptable to do business with the County. This applies to (but is not limited to) the company, subcontractors and employees.

- 3.4 Invoices and Payments
 - 3.4.1 The Contractor shall submit one legible copy of their detailed invoice before payment(s) will be made. Incomplete invoices will not be processed. At a minimum, the invoice must provide the following information:

 - Freight (if applicable)
 - Extended price
 - Total amount due
 - 3.4.2 Problems regarding billing or invoicing shall be directed to the Department as listed on the Purchase Order.

- 3.4.3 Payment shall only be made to the Contractor by Accounts Payable through the Maricopa County Vendor Express Payment Program. This is an Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) process. After Contract Award the Contractor shall complete the Vendor Registration Form located on the County Department of Finance Vendor Registration Web Site https://azdom-vss.hostams.com/webapp/PRDVSS1X1/AltSelfService.
- 3.4.4 Discounts offered in the contract shall be calculated based on the date a properly completed invoice is received by the County.
- 3.4.5 EFT payments to the routing and account numbers designated by the Contractor will include the details on the specific invoices that the payment covers. The Contractor is required to discuss remittance delivery capabilities with their designated financial institution for access to those details.
- 3.5 Applicable Taxes

Payment of Taxes: The Contractor shall pay all applicable taxes. With respect to any installation labor on items that are not attached to real property performed by Contractor under the terms of this Contract, the installation labor cost and the gross receipts for materials provided shall be listed separately on the Contractor's invoices.

State and Local Transaction Privilege Taxes: To the extent any State and local transaction privilege taxes apply to sales made under the terms of this Contract it is the responsibility of the seller to collect and remit all applicable taxes to the proper taxing jurisdiction of authority.

Tax Indemnification: Contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all Federal, State, and local taxes applicable to its operation and any persons employed by the Contractor. Contractor shall, and require all subcontractors to, hold Maricopa County harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal, and/or State and local laws and regulations, and any other costs including; transaction privilege taxes, unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security, and Worker's Compensation.

- 3.5.1 It is the responsibility of the contractor to determine any and all applicable taxes and include those taxes in their proposal. The legal liability to remit the tax is on the entity conducting business in Arizona. Tax is not a determining factor in contract award.
- 3.5.2 The County will look at the price or offer submitted and will not deduct, add, or alter pricing based on speculation or application of any taxes, nor will the County provide contractor any advice or guidance regarding taxes. If you have questions regarding your tax liability, seek advice from a tax professional prior to submitting your bid. You may also find information at https://www.azdor.gov/Business.aspx. Once your bid is submitted, the offer is valid for the time specified in this solicitation, regardless of mistake or omission of tax liability. If the County finds over payment of a project due to tax consideration that was not due, the contractor will be liable to the County for that amount, and by contracting with the County agrees to remit any overpayments back to the County for miscalculations on taxes included in a bid price.
- 3.5.3 Tax Indemnification: Contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all Federal, State, and local taxes applicable to their operation and any persons employed by the contractor. Contractor shall, and require all subcontractors to, hold the County harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages, and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal and/or State and local laws and regulations, and any other costs including: transaction privilege taxes, unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security, and Workers' Compensation. Contractor may be required to establish, to the satisfaction of County, that any and all fees and taxes due to the City or the State of Arizona for any license or transaction privilege

taxes, use taxes, or similar excise taxes are currently paid (except for matters under legal protest).

3.6 Tax (Services)

No tax shall be invoiced or paid against Contractor's labor. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine any and all applicable taxes and include the cost in the proposal price.

3.7 Tax (Commodities)

Tax shall not be invoiced against Contractor's labor. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine any and all applicable taxes and include the tax percentage in their proposal.

3.8 Performance

It shall be the contractor's responsibility to meet the proposed performance requirements. The **County** reserves the right to obtain services on the open market in the event the contractor fails to perform, and any price differential will be charged against the contractor.

3.9 Post Award Meeting

The Contractor may be required to attend a post-award meeting with the Department to discuss the terms and conditions of this Contract. This meeting will be coordinated by the Procurement Officer of the Contract.

3.10 Strategic Alliance for Volume Expenditures (\$AVE)

The County is a member of the \$AVE cooperative purchasing group. \$AVE includes the State of Arizona, many Phoenix metropolitan area municipalities, and many K-12 unified school districts. Under the \$AVE Cooperative Purchasing Agreement, and with the concurrence of the successful Respondent under this solicitation, a member of \$AVE may access a contract resulting from a solicitation issued by the County. If you do not want to grant such access to a member of \$AVE, please state so in your bid. In the absence of a statement to the contrary, the County will assume that you do wish to grant access to any contract that may result from this bid.

3.11 Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreements (ICPA's)

County currently holds ICPA's with numerous governmental entities. These agreements allow those entities, with the approval of the Contractor, to purchase their requirements under the terms and conditions of the County Contract. It is the responsibility of the non-County government entity to perform its own due diligence on the acceptability of the Contract under its procurement rules, processes and procedures.

4.0 CONTRACTUAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

4.1 Contract Term

This Invitation for Bid is for awarding a firm, fixed-price purchasing contract to cover a term of one year.

4.2 Option to Renew

The County may, at its option and with the concurrence of the Contractor, renew the term of this Contract up to a maximum of four additional years, (or at the County's sole discretion, extend the contract on a month to month basis for a maximum of six months after expiration). The Contractor shall be notified in writing by the Office of Procurement Services of the County's intention to renew the contract term at least sixty calendar days prior to the expiration of the original contract term.

4.3 Contract Completion

In preparation for contract completion, the contractor shall make all reasonable efforts for an orderly transition of its duties and responsibilities to another provider and/or to the County. This may include, but is not limited to, preparation of a transition plan and cooperation with the County or other providers in the transition. The transition includes the transfer of all records and other data in the possession, custody, or control of the **c**ontractor that are required to be provided to the County either by the terms of this agreement or as a matter of law. The provisions of this clause shall survive the expiration or termination of this agreement.

4.4 Price Adjustments

Any requests for reasonable price adjustments must be submitted 60 days prior to the contract expiration date. Requests for adjustment in cost of labor and/or materials must be supported by appropriate documentation. The reasonableness of the request will be determined by comparing the request with the Consumer Price Index or by performing a market survey. If County agrees to the adjusted price terms, County shall issue written approval of the change and provide an updated version of the contract. The new change shall not be in effect until the date stipulated on the contract.

4.5 Indemnification

- 4.5.1 To the fullest extent permitted by law, and to the extent that claims, damages, losses, or expenses are not covered and paid by insurance purchased by the contractor, the contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County (as Owner), its agents, representatives, agents, officers, directors, officials, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses (including, but not limited to attorneys' fees, court costs, expert witness fees, and the costs and attorneys' fees for appellate proceedings) arising out of, or alleged to have resulted from, the negligent acts, errors, omissions, or mistakes relating to the performance of this contract.
- 4.5.2 Contractor's duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, its agents, representatives, agents, officers, directors, officials, and employees shall arise in connection with any claim, damage, loss, or expense that is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, death, or injury to, impairment of, or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting therefrom, caused by negligent acts, errors, omissions, or mistakes in the performance of this contract, but only to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of the contractor, a subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or anyone for whose acts they may be liable, regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss, or expense is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.
- 4.5.3 The amount and type of insurance coverage requirements set forth herein will in no way be construed as limiting the scope of the indemnity in this **paragraph section**.
- 4.5.4 The scope of this indemnification does not extend to the sole negligence of County.

4.6 Insurance

4.6.1 Contractor, at contractor's own expense, shall purchase and maintain, at a minimum, the herein stipulated minimum insurance from a company or companies duly licensed by the State of Arizona and possessing an AM Best, Inc. category rating of B++. In lieu of State of Arizona licensing, the stipulated insurance may be purchased from a company or companies, which are authorized to do business in the State of Arizona, provided that said insurance companies meet the approval of County. The form of any insurance policies and forms must be acceptable to County.

- 4.6.2 All insurance required herein shall be maintained in full force and effect until all work or service required to be performed under the terms of the contract is satisfactorily completed and formally accepted. Failure to do so may, at the sole discretion of County, constitute a material breach of this contract.
- 4.6.3 In the event that the insurance required is written on a claims-made basis, contractor warrants that any retroactive date under the policy shall precede the effective date of this contract and either continuous coverage will be maintained, or an extended discovery period will be exercised for a period of two years beginning at the time work under this contract is completed.
- 4.6.4 Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects County, and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by County shall not contribute to it.
- 4.6.5 Any failure to comply with the claim reporting provisions of the insurance policies or any breach of an insurance policy warranty shall not affect the County's right to coverage afforded under the insurance policies.
- 4.6.6 The insurance policies may provide coverage that contains deductibles or self-insured retentions. Such deductible and/or self-insured retentions shall not be applicable with respect to the coverage provided to County under such policies. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the deductible and/or self-insured retention and County, at its option, may require **c**ontractor to secure payment of such deductibles or self-insured retentions by a surety bond or an irrevocable and unconditional letter of credit.
- 4.6.7 The insurance policies required by this contract, except Workers' Compensation and Errors and Omissions, shall name County, its agents, representatives, officers, directors, officials, and employees as **a**dditional insureds.
- 4.6.8 The policies required hereunder, except Workers' Compensation and Errors and Omissions (Professional Liability) Insurance, shall contain a waiver of transfer of rights of recovery (subrogation) against County, its agents, representatives, officers, directors, officials and employees for any claims arising out of contractor's work or service.
- 4.6.9 If available, the insurance policies required by this contract may be combined with Commercial Umbrella Insurance policies to meet the minimum limit requirements. If a Commercial Umbrella insurance policy is utilized to meet insurance requirements, the Certificate of Insurance shall indicate which lines the Commercial Umbrella Insurance covers.
 - 4.6.9.1 Commercial General Liability

Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance with a limit of not less than \$2,000,000 for each occurrence, \$4,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate, and \$4,000,000 General Aggregate Limit. The policy shall include coverage for premises liability, bodily injury, broad form property damage, personal injury, products and completed operations and blanket contractual coverage, and shall not contain any provisions which would serve to limit **third-party** action over claims. There shall be no endorsement or modifications of the CGL limiting the scope of coverage for liability arising from explosion, collapse, or underground property damage.

4.6.9.2 Professional Liability

Contractor shall maintain Professional Liability insurance which will provide coverage for any and all acts arising out of the work or services performed by the contractor under the terms of this contract, with a limit of not less than \$4 2,000,000 for each claim, and \$3,000,000 aggregate claims.

4.6.9.3 Cyber Network Security, and Privacy Liability

Cyber, Network Security and Privacy Liability Insurance with a limit of not less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence. The policy shall include, but not be limited to; coverage for all directors, officers, agents and employees of the contractor, losses with respect to network risks (such as data breaches, unauthorized access or use, and ID theft of data), invasion of privacy (regardless of the type of media involved in the loss of private information), crisis management, identity theft response costs, breach notification costs, credit remediation, and credit monitoring, defense, and claims expenses, regulatory defense costs plus fines and penalties, cyber extortion, electronic data restoration expenses (data asset protection), network business interruption, computer fraud coverage, funds transfer loss, third-party fidelity, theft, no requirement for arrest and conviction, and loss outside the premises of the named insured.

Policy Limit:

- 4.6.9.3.1 The policy shall be issued with minimum limits of \$100,000
- 4.6.9.3.2 The policy shall include coverage for all directors, officers, agents, and employees of the Contractor
- 4.6.9.3.3 The policy shall include coverage for third party fidelity
- 4.6.9.3.4 The policy shall include coverage for theft
- 4.6.9.3.5 The policy shall contain no requirement for arrest and conviction
- 4.6.9.3.6 The policy shall cover loss outside the premises of the Named Insured
- 4.6.9.3.7 The policy shall endorse (Blanket Endorsements are not acceptable) the department as loss payee as our interest may appear.
- 4.6.10 Certificates of Insurance
 - 4.6.10.1 Prior to contract award, contractor shall furnish the County with valid and complete certificates of insurance, or formal endorsements as required by the contract in the form provided by the County, issued by contractor's insurer(s), as evidence that policies providing the required coverage, conditions, and limits required by this contract are in full force and effect. Such certificates shall identify this contract number and title.
 - 4.6.10.2 In the event any insurance policy(ies) required by this contract is (are) written on a **claims-made** basis, coverage shall extend for two years past completion and acceptance of **c**ontractor's work or services and as evidenced by annual Certificates of Insurance.
 - 4.6.10.3 If a policy does expire during the life of the contract, a renewal certificate must be sent to County 15 calendar days prior to the expiration date.
- 4.6.11 Cancellation and Expiration Notice

Applicable to all insurance policies required within the insurance requirements of this contract, contractor's insurance shall not be permitted to expire, be suspended, be canceled, or be materially changed for any reason without 30 calendar days prior written notice to Maricopa County. Contractor must provide notice to Maricopa County, within two business days of receipt, if they receive notice of a policy that has been or will be suspended, canceled, materially changed for any reason, has expired, or will be expiring. Such notice shall be sent directly to Maricopa County Office of Procurement Services and shall be mailed, or hand delivered to 160 South 4th Avenue, Phoenix, AZ 85003, or emailed to the procurement officer noted in the solicitation.

4.7 Force Majeure

- 4.7.1 Neither party shall be liable for failure of performance, nor incur any liability to the other party on account of any loss or damage resulting from any delay or failure to perform all or any part of this contract, if such delay or failure is caused by events, occurrences, or causes beyond the reasonable control and without negligence of the parties. Such events, occurrences, or causes will include, **but are not limited to, acts** of God/nature (including fire, flood, earthquake, storm, hurricane, or other natural disaster), war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war is declared or not), civil war, riots, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, terrorist activities, nationalization, government sanction, lockout, blockage, embargo, labor dispute, strike, and interruption or failure of electricity or telecommunication service, and pandemic.
- 4.7.2 **Each as applicable**, shall give the other party notice of its inability to perform and particulars in reasonable detail, of the cause of the inability. Each party must use best efforts to remedy the situation and remove, as soon as practicable, the cause of its inability to perform or comply.
- 4.7.3 The party asserting Force Majeure as a cause for non-performance shall have the burden of proving that reasonable steps were taken to minimize delay or damages caused by foreseeable events, that all non-excused obligations were substantially fulfilled, and that the other **p**arty was timely notified of the likelihood or actual occurrence which would justify such an assertion, so that other prudent precautions could be contemplated.
- 4.8 Ordering Authority

Any request for purchase shall be accompanied by a valid purchase order issued by Office of Procurement Services, a purchase order issued by the using department, or direction by a Certified Agency Procurement Aid (CAPA) with a Purchase Card for payment.

Any request for purchase shall be accompanied by a valid purchase order issued by a County department or directed by a Certified Agency Procurement Aid (CAPA) with a purchase card for payment.

- 4.9 No Minimum or Maximum Purchase Obligation
 - 4.9.1 This contract does not guarantee any minimum or maximum purchases will be made. Orders will only be placed under this contract when the County identifies a need and proper authorization and documentation have been approved.
 - 4.9.2 Contractors agree to accept verbal notification of cancellation of purchase orders from the County Procurement Officer with written notification to follow. Contractor specifically acknowledges to be bound by this cancellation policy.
- 4.10 Purchase Orders
 - 4.10.1 County reserves the right to cancel purchase orders within a reasonable period of time after issuance. Should a purchase order be canceled, the County agrees to reimburse the contractor for actual and documentable costs incurred by the contractor in response to the purchase order. The County will not reimburse the contractor for any costs incurred after receipt of County notice of cancellation, or for lost profits, or for shipment of product prior to issuance of purchase order.
 - 4.10.2 Contractors agree to accept verbal notification of cancellation of purchase orders from the County with written notification to follow. Contractor specifically acknowledges to be bound by this cancellation policy.

4.11 Suspension of Work

The **p**rocurement **o**fficer may order the **c**ontractor, in writing, to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of the work of this contract for the period of time that the **p**rocurement **o**fficer determines appropriate for the convenience of the County. No adjustment shall be made under this clause for any suspension, delay, or interruption to the extent that performance would have been so suspended, delayed, or interrupted by any other cause, including the fault or negligence of the **c**ontractor. No request for adjustment under this clause shall be granted unless the claim, in an amount stated, is asserted in writing as soon as practicable after the termination of the suspension, delay, or interruption, but not later than the date of final payment under the contract.

4.12 Stop Work Order

- 4.12.1 The procurement officer may, at any time, by written order to the contractor, require the contractor to stop all, or any part, of the work called for by this contract for a period of 90 calendar days after the order is delivered to the contractor, and for any further period to which the parties may agree. The order shall be specifically identified as a stop work order issued under this clause. Upon receipt of the order, the contractor shall immediately comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage. Within a period of 90 calendar days after a stop work order is delivered to the contractor, or within any extension of that period to which the parties shall have agreed, the procurement officer shall either:
- 4.12.2 cancel the stop work order; or
- 4.12.3 terminate the work covered by the order as provided in the **Termination for** Default or the Termination for Convenience clause of this contract.
- 4.12.4 The procurement officer may make an equitable adjustment in the delivery schedule and/or contract price, and the contract shall be modified, in writing, accordingly, if the contractor demonstrates that the stop work order resulted in an increase in costs to the contractor.
- 4.13 Termination for Convenience

Maricopa County may terminate the resultant contract for convenience by providing 60 calendar days advance notice to the **c**ontractor.

- 4.14 Termination for Default
 - 4.14.1 The County may, by written Notice of **D**efault to the **c**ontractor, terminate this contract in whole or in part if the **c**ontractor fails to:
 - 4.14.1.1 deliver the supplies or to perform the services within the time specified in this contract or any extension;
 - 4.14.1.2 make progress, so as to endanger performance of this contract; or
 - 4.14.1.3 **P**erform any of the other provisions of this contract.
 - 4.14.2 The County's right to terminate this contract under these subparagraphs may be exercised if the contractor does not cure such failure within 10 business days (or more if authorized in writing by the County) after receipt of a **Notice to Cure** from the procurement officer specifying the failure.

4.15 Statutory Right of Cancellation for Conflict of Interest

Notice is given that, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) § 38-511, the County may cancel any contract without penalty or further obligation within three years after execution of the contract, if any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the contract on behalf of the County is at any time, while the contract or any extension of the contract is in effect, an employee or agent of any other party to the contract in any capacity or consultant to any other party of the contract with respect to the subject matter of the contract. Additionally, pursuant to A.R.S § 38-511, the County may recoup any fee or commission paid or due to any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the contract on behalf of the County from any other party to the contract arising as the result of the contract.

4.16 Offset for Damages

In addition to all other remedies at Law or Equity, the County may offset from any money due to the contractor any amounts contractor owes to the County for damages resulting from breach or deficiencies in performance of the contract.

- 4.17 Subcontracting
 - 4.17.1 **Contractor** may not assign to another **contractor** or subcontract to another party for performance of the terms and conditions hereof without the written consent of the County. All correspondence authorizing subcontracting must reference the **bid** serial number and identify the job **or** project.
 - 4.17.2 The subcontractor's rate for the job shall not exceed that of the prime contractor's rate, as bid in the pricing section, unless the prime contractor is willing to absorb any higher rates. The subcontractor's invoice shall be invoiced directly to the prime contractor, who in turn shall pass-through the costs to the County, without markup. A copy of the subcontractor's invoice must accompany the prime contractor's invoice.
- 4.18 Amendments

All amendments to this contract shall be in writing and shall be approved/signed by both parties. Maricopa County Office of Procurement Services shall be responsible for approving all amendments for Maricopa County.

4.19 Additions/Deletions of Service

The County reserves the right to add and/or delete services to a contract. If a service requirement is deleted, payment to the Contractor will be reduced proportionately, to the amount of service reduced in accordance with the contract price. If additional services are required from a contract, prices for such additions will be negotiated between the Contractor and the County.

The County reserves the right to add and/or delete services to a contract. If additional services are required from a contract, prices for such additions will be negotiated between the contractor and the County.

- 4.20 Access to and Retention of Records for the Purpose of Audit and/or Other Review
 - 4.20.1 In accordance with section MCI-374 373 of the Maricopa County Procurement Code, the contractor agrees to retain (physical or digital copies of) all books, records, accounts, statements, reports, files, and other records and back-up documentation relevant to this contract for six years after final payment or until after the resolution of any audit questions which could be more than six years, whichever is latest. The County, Federal or State auditors and any other persons duly authorized by the department shall have full access to, and the right to examine, copy, and make use of, any and all said materials.

- 4.20.2 If the contractor's books, records, accounts, statements, reports, files, and other records and back-up documentation relevant to this contract are not sufficient to support and document that requested services were provided, the contractor shall reimburse Maricopa County for the services not so adequately supported and documented.
- 4.21 Audit Disallowances

If at any time it is determined by the County that a cost for which payment has been made is a disallowed cost, the County shall notify the contractor in writing of the disallowance. The course of action to address the disallowance shall be at sole discretion of the County, and may include either an adjustment to future invoices, request for credit, request for a check, or a deduction from current invoices submitted by the contractor equal to the amount of the disallowance, or to require reimbursement forthwith of the disallowed amount by the contractor by issuing a check payable to Maricopa County.

4.22 Strict Compliance

Acceptance by County of a performance that is not in strict compliance with the terms of the contract shall not be deemed to be a waiver of strict compliance with respect to all other terms of the contract.

4.23 Validity

The invalidity, in whole or in part, of any provision of this contract shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of the contract.

4.24 Severability

The removal, in whole or in part, of any provision of this contract shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of this contract.

- 4.25 Rights in Data
 - 4.25.1 The County shall have the use of data and reports resulting from a contract without additional cost or other restriction except as may be established by law or applicable regulation. Each party shall supply to the other party, upon request, any available information that is relevant to a contract and to the performance thereunder.
 - 4.25.2 Data, records, reports, and all other information generated for the County by a third party as the result of a contract are the property of the County and shall be provided in a format designated by the County or shall be and remain accessible to the County into perpetuity.
- 4.26 Relationships
 - 4.26.1 In the performance of the services described herein, the contractor shall act solely as an independent contractor, and nothing herein or implied herein shall at any time be construed as to create the relationship of employer and employee, co-employee, partnership, principal and agent, or joint venture between the County and the contractor.
 - 4.26.2 The County reserves the right of final approval on proposed staff. Also, upon request by the County, the contractor will be required to remove any employees working on County projects and substitute personnel based on the discretion of the County within two business days, unless previously approved by the County.

4.27 Non-Discrimination

Contractor agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. Executive Order 2009-09 supersedes Executive order 99.4 and amends Executive order 75-5 and may be viewed and downloaded from the Arizona Memory Project's website, <u>https://azmemory.azlibrary.gov/digital/collection/execorders/id/680/, and which is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein. During the performance of this contract, Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee, client or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin.</u>

Contractor agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09, including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. Executive Order 2009-09 supersedes Executive Order 99-4 and amends Executive Order 75-5 and is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein. During the performance of this contract, contractor shall not discriminate against any employee, client, or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin. (Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 downloaded from the Arizona Memory Project can be at http://azmemory.azlibrary.gov/cdm/singleitem/collection/execorders/id/680/rec/1.)

4.28 Written Certification Pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-393.01

If vendor engages in for-profit activity and has 10 or more employees, and if this **a**greement has a value of \$100,000 or more, vendor certifies it is not currently engaged in, and agrees for the duration of this **a**greement to not engage in, a boycott of goods or services from Israel. - 4.29 Certification Regarding Debarment and Suspension
 - 4.29.1 The undersigned (authorized official signing on behalf of the contractor) certifies to the best of his or her knowledge and belief that the contractor, its current officers, and directors;
 - 4.29.1.1 are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from being awarded any contract or grant by any United States **d**epartment or **a**gency or any state, or local jurisdiction;
 - 4.29.1.2 have not within a three-year period preceding this contract:
 - 4.29.1.2.1 been convicted of fraud or any criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or as the result of performing a government entity (Federal, state, or local) transaction or contract;
 - 4.29.1.2.2 been convicted of violation of any Federal or state antitrust statutes or **conviction** for embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property regarding a government entity transaction or contract;
 - 4.29.1.2.3 are not presently indicted or criminally charged by a government entity (Federal, state, or local) with commission of any criminal offenses in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or as the result of performing a government entity public (Federal, state, or local) transaction or contract;
 - 4.29.1.2.4 are not presently facing any civil charges from any governmental entity regarding obtaining, attempting to obtain, or from performing any governmental entity contract or other transaction;

- 4.29.1.2.5 have not within a three year period preceding this contract had any public transaction (Federal, state, or local) terminated for cause or default.
- 4.29.2 If any of the above circumstances described in the paragraph are applicable to the entity submitting a bid for this requirement, include with your bid an explanation of the matter including any final resolution.
- 4.29.3 The Contractor shall include, without modification, this clause in all lower tier covered transactions (i.e. transactions with subcontractors) and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions related to this contract. If this clause is applicable to a subcontractor, the Contractor shall include the information required by this clause with their bid.
- 4.30 Verification Regarding Compliance with A.R.S. § 41-4401 and Federal Immigration Laws and Regulations
 - 4.30.1 By entering into the contract, the contractor warrants compliance with the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA using E-Verify) and all other Federal immigration laws and regulations related to the immigration status of its employees and A.R.S. § 23-214(A). Contractor shall obtain statements from its subcontractors certifying compliance and shall furnish the statements to the procurement officer upon request. These warranties shall remain in effect through the term of the contract. Contractor and its subcontractors shall also maintain Employment Eligibility Verification forms (I-9) as required by the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended from time to time, for all employees performing work under the contract and verify employee compliance using the E-Verify system and shall keep a record of the verification for the duration of the employee's employment or at least three years, whichever is longer. I-9 forms are available for download at www.uscis.gov.
 - 4.30.2 The County retains the legal right to inspect documents of contractor and subcontractor employees performing work under this contract to verify compliance with paragraph 4.30.1 of this section. Contractor and subcontractor shall be given reasonable notice of the County's intent to inspect and shall make the documents available at the time and date specified. Should the County suspect or find that the contractor or any of its subcontractors are not in compliance, the County will consider this a material breach of the contract and may pursue any and all remedies allowed by law, including, but not limited to; suspension of work, termination of the contract for default, and suspension and/or debarment of the contractor. All costs necessary to verify compliance are the responsibility of the contractor.
- 4.31 Contractor Employee Whistleblower Rights and Requirement to Inform Employees of Whistleblower Rights
 - 4.31.1 The parties agree that this contract and employees working on this Contract will be subject to the whistleblower rights and remedies in the pilot program on Contractor employee whistleblower protections established at 41 U.S.C. § 4712 by section 828 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013 (Pub. L. 112–239) and section 3.908 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation;

The parties agree that this contract and employees working on this contract will be subject to the contractor employee whistleblower protections established by Title 41 U.S.C. § 4712 and Section 3.908 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation.

4.31.2 Contractor shall inform its employees in writing, in the predominant language of the workforce, of employee whistleblower rights and protections under 41 U.S.C. § 4712, as described in section 3.908 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation. Documentation of such employee notification must be kept on file by contractor and copies provided to County upon request.

- 4.31.3 Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (4.30.3), in all subcontracts over the simplified acquisition threshold (\$150,000 as of September 2013).
- 4.31.4 Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph, in all subcontracts over the simplified acquisition threshold (\$250,000 as of Fiscal Year 2018).
- 4.32 Contractor License Requirement
 - 4.32.1 **Contractor** shall procure all permits, insurance, **and** licenses, and pay the charges and fees necessary and incidental to the lawful conduct of his/her business, and as necessary complete any **requirements**, by any and all governmental or non-governmental entities as mandated to maintain compliance with and **remain** in good standing. **Contractor** shall keep fully informed of existing and future trade or industry requirements, **and** Federal, **state**, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations which in any manner affect the fulfillment of a contract and shall comply with the same. Contractor shall immediately notify both Office of Procurement Services and the department of any and all changes concerning permits, insurance or licenses.
 - 4.32.2 Contractors furnishing finished products, materials, or articles of merchandise that will require installation or attachment as part of the **contract shall** possess any licenses required. Contractor is not relieved of its obligation to possess the required licenses by subcontracting of the labor portion of the contract. Contractors are advised to contact the Arizona Registrar of Contractors, Chief of Licensing, to ascertain licensing requirements for a particular contract. Contractor shall identify which license(s), if any, the Registrar of Contractors requires for performance of the contract.

4.33 Influence

- 4.33.1 As prescribed in MC1-1203 of the Maricopa County Procurement Code, any effort to influence an employee or agent to breach the Maricopa County Ethical Code of Conduct or any ethical conduct, may be grounds for disbarment or suspension under MC1-902.
- 4.33.2 An attempt to influence includes, but is not limited to:
 - 4.33.2.1 A person offering or providing a gratuity, gift, tip, present, donation, money, entertainment or educational passes or tickets, or any type of valuable contribution or **subsidy that** is offered or given with the intent to influence a decision, obtain a contract, garner favorable treatment, or gain favorable consideration of any kind
- 4.33.3 If a person attempts to influence any employee or agent of Maricopa County, the chief procurement officer, or his designee, reserves the right to seek any remedy provided by the Maricopa County Procurement Code, any remedy in equity or in the law, or any remedy provided by this contract.
- 4.33.4 ABSOLUTELY NO CONTACT BETWEEN THE RESPONDENT AND ANY COUNTY PERSONNEL, OTHER THAN THE OFFICE OF PROCUREMENT SERVICES, IS ALLOWED DURING THE SOLICITATION PROCESS UNLESS THE COMMUNICATION IS IN REGARD TO PRE-EXISTING BUSINESS WITH THE COUNTY. ANY COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING THE SOLICITATION, ITS PARTICIPANTS OR ANY DOCUMENTATION PRIOR TO THE CONTRACT AWARD MAY BE GROUNDS FOR DISMISSAL OF THE RESPONDENT FROM THE EVALUATION PROCESS.

4.34 Confidentiality Information

In the course of the solicitation process, the County may disclose information that is proprietary or confidential. By submitting a bid to the solicitation, the offeror agrees that, except as necessary to prepare a response to this solicitation, neither it nor its agents or employees will communicate, divulge, or disseminate to any third-party persons or entities, any information that is disclosed to it by the County during the course of these discussions without the express written authorization of the County. If the offeror does disclose County proprietary or confidential information to a third party in preparing a response to this solicitation, it shall require the third party to acknowledge and comply with this provision.

- 4.34.1 Any information obtained in the course of performing this contract may include information that is proprietary or confidential to the County. This provision establishes the contractor's obligation regarding such information.
- 4.34.2 Contractor shall establish and maintain procedures and controls that are adequate to assure that no information contained in its records and/or obtained from the County or from others in carrying out its functions (services) under the contract shall be used by or disclosed by it, its agents, officers, or employees, except as required to efficiently perform duties under the contract. Contractor's procedures and controls, at a minimum, must be the same procedures and controls it uses to protect its own proprietary or confidential information. If, at any time during the duration of the contract, the County determines that the procedures and controls in place are not adequate, the contractor shall institute any new and/or additional measures requested by the County within 15 business calendar days of the written request to do so.
- 4.34.3 Any requests to the contractor for County proprietary or confidential information shall be referred to the County for review and approval, prior to any dissemination.
- 4.35 Public Records

Under Arizona law, all offers submitted and opened are public records and must be retained by the records manager at the Maricopa County Office of Procurement Services. Offers shall be open to public inspection and copying after contract award and execution, except for such offers or sections thereof determined to contain proprietary or confidential information by the Office of Procurement Services. If an offeror believes that information in its offer or any resulting contract should not be released in response to a public record request, under Arizona law, the offeror shall indicate the specific information deemed confidential or proprietary and submit a statement with its offer detailing the reasons that the information should not be disclosed. Such reasons shall include the specific harm or prejudice which may arise from disclosure. The records manager of the Office of Procurement Services shall determine whether the identified information is confidential pursuant to the Maricopa County Procurement Code.

4.36 Integration

This contract represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, proposals, communications, understandings, representations, or agreements, whether oral or written, expressed or implied.

4.37 Uniform Administrative Requirements

By entering into this contract, the contractor agrees to comply with all applicable provisions of Title 2, Subtitle A, Chapter II, PART 200—UNIFORM ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS, COST PRINCIPLES, AND AUDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR FEDERAL AWARDS contained in Title 2 C.F.R. § 200 *et seq.*

4.38 Governing Law

This contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Arizona. Venue for any actions or lawsuits involving this contract will be in Maricopa County Superior Court, Phoenix, Arizona.

4.39 AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

- 4.39.1 The provisions of this contract relating to payment shall become effective when funds assigned for the purpose of compensating the contractor as herein provided are actually available to County for disbursement. The County will be the sole judge and authority in determining the availability of funds under this contract. County will keep the contractor fully informed as to the availability of funds.
- 4.39.2 If any action is taken by any State agency, Federal department, or any other agency or instrumentality to suspend, decrease, or terminate its fiscal obligations under, or in connection with, this contract, County may amend, suspend, decrease, or terminate its obligations under, or in connection with, this contract. In the event of termination, County will be liable for payment only for services rendered prior to the effective date of the termination, provided that such services are performed in accordance with the provisions of this contract. County will give written notice of the effective date of any suspension, amendment, or termination under this section, at least 10 days in advance.
