TITLE: Motion Approving Florida Department of Health EMS Matching Program

Grant Award - \$14,850 - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the acceptance of a grant in the amount of \$14,850 from the Florida Department of Health (FDOH) for the purchase of first aid kits for law enforcement personnel.

Background

In February 2025, the City submitted an application to FDOH for funding through the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Matching Grant Program. The purpose of the grant is to improve and expand EMS by acquiring individual first aid kits for distribution amongst patrol officers. The kits, which include tourniquets, gauze and chest seals, will allow officers to commence life-saving treatment on scene before the arrival of a paramedic, thereby potentially preventing permanent injury or death. Patrol officers will receive training on the appropriate use of all items within the first aid kit.

The City will meet the grant's required 25% cash match by funding the balance of the cost in the amount of \$4,950. The period of performance is July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026.

Resource Impact

The total project cost is \$19,800. There is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$14,850, contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment (CAM #25-0564).
