TITLE: Motion to Approve Donation to the 28th National Conference on Preventing
Crime in the Black Community

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a donation to the 28th National Conference on Preventing Crime in the Black Community in the amount of \$3,000 utilizing State Law Enforcement Trust Fund.

Background

The 28th National Preventing Crime in the Black Community Conference is a collaborative effort sponsored by Attorney General Pam Bondi to foster communication and action among practitioners through sharing innovative ideas and successful crime prevention strategies in Black communities. A major component of the program will focus on youth violence.

In addition, the conference will include presentations by National and State leaders, motivational speakers, workshops on notable efforts to reduce drug abuse, community crime prevention and program models that are transferable to other communities.

Juvenile crime in Black communities is a national issue and consistent across all boundaries. In Fort Lauderdale's 33311 zip code area, a predominantly Black community, there is more juvenile crime than any other areas in our City. The Fort Lauderdale Police Department's support of this conference will benefit our residents and our Police Department's efforts to reduce crime. Police personnel and youth residing in Fort Lauderdale's 33311 zip code area will attend this conference.

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the city in the amount of \$3,000.
