- TITLE: Resolution Adopting the Final Five-Year Community Investment Plan for Fiscal Years 2024 – 2028 and Appropriating Funding for Fiscal Year 2024 Community Investment Plan Projects - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution adopting the Five-Year Community Investment Plan and appropriating funding for Fiscal Year 2024 Community Investment Plan Projects.

Background

The Community Investment Plan (CIP) is a planning document that sets forth the City's capital improvements to ensure that municipal facilities and infrastructure improvements are appropriate and adequate to serve the needs of the neighbors of the City of Fort Lauderdale. The CIP is a multi-year funding plan as follows:

- ✓ Projects with unspent balances: These are existing projects that are ongoing. The unspent balance is re-appropriated and considered as part of the five-year total.
- Projects funded in the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget: These projects are recommended in the City Manager's Final CIP and budget with funding appropriated in concert with the City Commission's Adopted Budget.
- ✓ Projects planned for Fiscal Years 2025 2028: These projects are planned to be funded and will be updated on an annual basis and considered for funding in the respective year of the request. Funding will not be appropriated until the annual adoption of the CIP pursuant to City Commission action.

The Tentative Community Investment Plan was approved by the City Commission on September 5, 2023. Since that time, changes have been made to the Tentative FY 2024 – FY 2028 Community Investment Plan, including:

A decrease in the amount of \$250,000 in General Capital Projects for the Annual Sidewalk Gap Construction in FY 2024, along with a commensurate increase of \$250,000 in funding to this project in FY 2025 due to the timing of the Sidewalk Gap Analysis study.
