Mayor Trantalis recognized Ted Inserra, 912 SW 19th Street, River Oaks Civic Association President. Mr. Inserra discussed his viewpoint opposing this Agenda item and explained related concerns.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Milos Majstorovic, Transportation and Mobility Department Acting Director. Mr. Majstorovic provided context and background information for this Agenda item and remarked on efforts to address Mr. Inserra's concerns regarding tree removal.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Majstorovic explained the design team's efforts to mitigate removing a large number of trees.

Mayor Trantalis discussed his understanding and prior Commission concerns related to the Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) effort to create a path between Federal Highway and the proposed commuter rail station, reducing the existing tree canopy, enhancing the usability of SW 17th Street, and working with stakeholders to ensure achievement of the best possible scenario.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Chris Restrepo, Broward County MPO. Mr. Restrepo explained MPO's efforts with community stakeholders to address tree removal concerns and confirmed funding to create tree canopy shade structures along that corridor. Mr. Restrepo noted that an existing Oak Tree would not be removed. As the design process moves forward, planned sidewalks between 4th Avenue and 9th Avenue would meander around existing trees.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Acting Assistant City Manager Ben Rogers. Mr. Rogers confirmed he met with Mr. Inserra to walk the site to address Mr. Inserra's concerns and expounded on related information.

Mayor Trantalis discussed the need for sidewalks in the area and expounded on his viewpoint. Mr. Restrepo said there is sufficient space to accommodate both sidewalks and trees.

In response to Commissioner Sturman's question, Mr. Restrepo provided a synopsis of community meetings and outreach efforts on this topic, expounded on stakeholder feedback, and cited examples.

In response to Commissioner Beasley-Pittman's question, Mr. Restrepo explained the location in front of Broward Health where several palm trees would be removed and replaced with a landscaped median and another type of tree that would provide a tree canopy.

> In response to Commissioner Sturman's question, Alfred Battle, Development Services Department Acting Director, explained information related to this amendment reducing the number of parking spaces for medical and dental offices and expounded on related details, which included the Planning and Zoning (P&Z) Board's recommendation.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Battle explained that the parking reduction amendment will apply to both new construction and existing medical and dental offices and remarked on the availability of ride share services and telemedicine. Mayor Trantalis remarked on his related experience. Further comment and discussion ensued.

In response to Commissioner Beasley-Pittman's question, Mr. Battle explained the benefits of parking reductions to medical and dental offices.

Commissioner Sturman remarked on possible repurposing of existing medical or dental office space.

In response to Commissioner Beasley-Pittman and Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Battle explained the allocation of one (1) parking space for every one hundred and fifty (150) square feet of gross square area of a medical or dental office. A two thousand foot (2000') medical or dental office would require approximately sixteen (16) to seventeen (17) parking spaces. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mayor Trantalis discussed his perspective and commented on related information. Mr. Battle remarked on feedback received from stakeholders and reiterated this was a recommendation from a P&Z

Board communication.

Vice Mayor Glassman remarked on the related P&Z Board Meeting Minutes and said their unanimous recommendation made sense. He expounded on related information and experience.

Commissioner Sturman remarked on the ability for further Commission discussion of this Agenda item prior to the Second Reading.
