TITLE: Agreement with the Sheriff for Use of the City's Compost Site

Recommendation

It is recommended the City Commission approve an agreement with the Sheriff of Broward County for the use of the City's compost site, 4030 South State Road 7, Dania Beach for law enforcement training and authorize execution of agreement.

Background

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department utilizes the city-owned Compost Site for Emergency Vehicle Operations Courses (EVOC), Field Force Training, SWAT Vehicle Assault Training, Armored Vehicle Tactics, Traffic Stop Orientation and SWAT Driver Training. The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) has made a request to utilize the Compost Site for SWAT and tactical driving (PIT) training. The proposed agreement would permit BSO to train on the site. All training conducted by BSO will be coordinated by the Fort Lauderdale Police Department's (FLPD) Training Unit in cooperation with the Public Works Department. In return, the Fort Lauderdale Police Department will be able to use BSO's training facilities when available to conduct FLPD training. The agreement has been reviewed and approved by the City Attorney's Office and Risk Management.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

Strategic Connections

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018* initiative, included within the Public Safety Cylinder of Excellence, specifically advancing:

- Goal 9: Be the safest urban coastal City in South Florida through preventative and responsive police and fire protection.
- Objective 1: Prevent and solve crime in all neighborhoods.
