
RESOLUTION NO. 23-185

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, RELATING TO THE PROVISION OF THE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ASSESSMENTS IN THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE; IMPOSING STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ASSESSMENTS AGAINST ASSESSED PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA; MODIFYING THE PRELIMINARY ANNUAL ASSESSMENT RESOLUTION NO. 23-143; APPROVING THE ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2020, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida (the "City Commission") adopted Ordinance No. C-20-18 (the "Ordinance") authorizing the City Commission to impose a stormwater management program assessment to fund all or any portion of the planning, construction, operation, maintenance, and administration of a public stormwater management system upon benefited parcels at a rate of assessment based on the special benefit accruing to such parcel from the provision of a stormwater management program; and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Ordinance the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 20-123 (the "Initial Assessment Resolution") that (a) describes the property to be located within the proposed stormwater management system benefit area; (b) describes the stormwater management program proposed for funding from proceeds of the assessments; (c) estimates the stormwater management program cost; (d) describes with particularity the proposed method of apportioning the stormwater management program cost among the parcels of property located within the proposed stormwater management system benefit area, such that the owner of any parcel of property can objectively determine the number of assessment units and the amount of the assessment; (e) describes the provisions, if any, for acceleration and prepayment of the assessment; (f) describes the provisions, if any, for reallocating the assessment upon future subdivision or other changes in condition that affects the method of apportioning the stormwater management program cost; and (g) includes specific legislative findings that recognize the fairness provided by the apportionment methodology; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Ordinance, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 20-154 (the "Final Assessment Resolution") that (a) created the stormwater management system benefit area; (b) confirmed the initial assessment resolution with such amendments, if any, as may be deemed appropriate by the city commission; (c) established the maximum amount of an assessment for each assessment unit; (d) approved the assessment roll, with such amendments as it deems just and right; and (e) determined the method of collection. The imposition of stormwater management program assessments requires certain processes such as notice and the preparation of the Assessment Roll; and

WHEREAS, Section 28-207 of the Ordinance (codified as Section 28-200.7 of the City of Fort Lauderdale's Code of Ordinances) provides for an annual process for the approval of the assessment roll through the adoption of an annual assessment resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 23-143 on July 5, 2023, initiating the process for reimposition of the stormwater management services assessment in the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2023, directing the preparation of an assessment roll, authorizing a public hearing and directing the provision of notice thereof, providing for rescission of conflicting provisions, severability and an effective date; and

WHEREAS, APPENDIX A of Resolution No. 23-143 contained a scrivener's error; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 28-200.6 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the final assessment resolution may confirm, modify or repeal the initial assessment resolution with such amendments, if any, as may be deemed appropriate by the City Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Assessment Roll has heretofore been made available for inspection by the public, as required by the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing has been published and mailed to those property owners proposed to be assessed and required to receive mailed notice pursuant to the Ordinance, notifying such property owner of the Owner's opportunity to be heard, the proof of publication being attached hereto as Appendix A; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 13, 2023, and comments and objections of all interested persons have been heard and considered as required by the terms of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission hereby finds and determines that the Stormwater Management Program Assessment to be imposed in accordance with this Resolution, provides an equitable method of funding the Project Cost of the Stormwater Management Program by fairly and reasonably allocating the cost based on the special benefit derived by Assessed Properties in the manner herein described; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the City of Fort Lauderdale to adopt this Annual Assessment Resolution for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2023; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY. This resolution is adopted pursuant to the Ordinance (Ordinance No. C-20-18), Article VIII, Section 2, Florida Constitution, Sections 166.021 and 166.041, Florida Statutes, and other applicable provisions of law.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION. This Resolution constitutes the Annual Assessment Resolution for the Stormwater Management Program Assessment for Fiscal Year 2023 as defined in the Ordinance. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined in this Resolution shall have the meanings defined in the Ordinance, the Initial Assessment Resolution and the Final Assessment Resolution.

SECTION 3. DESCRIPTION OF STORMWATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM BENEFIT AREA. The Stormwater Management System Benefit Area shall include all tax parcels within the City.

SECTION 4. IMPOSITION OF STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ASSESSMENTS. Stormwater Management Program Assessments shall be imposed against all Tax Parcels located wholly or partially within the Stormwater Management Program Assessment Area, with the exception of Government Property owned by a Contributing Government, for each Fiscal Year in which Obligations remain outstanding and are hereby found to be specially benefitted by the Stormwater Management Program in the amount of the maximum Annual Assessment set forth in the Assessment Roll and are hereby levied and imposed on all Tax Parcels described in the Assessment Roll. The Annual Assessment shall be computed in accordance with Section 2.03 of Resolution No. 20-123. When imposed, the Stormwater Management Program Assessments for each Fiscal Year shall constitute a lien upon such Tax Parcels, with the exception of Tax Parcels owned by an entity or individual not authorized to pay

special assessments under Florida law, pursuant to the Ordinance and shall be collected on the ad valorem tax bill in the manner authorized by the Uniform Assessment Collection Act and described in the Resolutions.

SECTION 5. APPROVAL OF ASSESSMENT ROLL. The Assessment Roll for the Stormwater Management Program Assessment Area that contains the Stormwater Management Program Assessments for those Tax Parcels, of which all or a portion are located within the Stormwater Management Program Assessment Area, which is currently on file with the City Clerk and attached as Appendix B, is hereby approved. Upon adoption of this Annual Assessment Resolution for the Stormwater Management Program Assessment Area for each Fiscal Year, the City Manager shall cause the certification and delivery of the Assessment Roll to the Tax Collector by September 15, in the manner prescribed by the Uniform Assessment Collection Act. The Assessment Roll, as delivered to the Tax Collector, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Roll in substantially the form attached hereto as Appendix C.


SECTION 6. MODIFICATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 23-143. Appendix A attached to Resolution No. 23-143 is hereby replaced by Appendix D attached hereto.

SECTION 7. SEVERABILITY. If any clause, section or other part of this resolution shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutional or invalid part shall be considered as eliminated and in no way affecting the validity of the other provisions of this resolution.

SECTION 8. CONFLICTS. This resolution or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith, be and the same are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Annual Assessment Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.

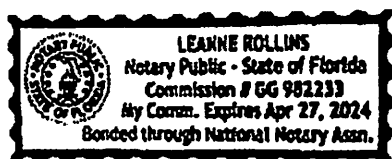

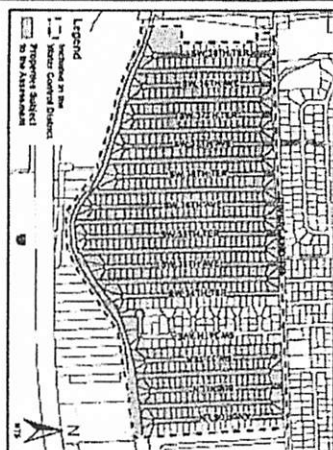

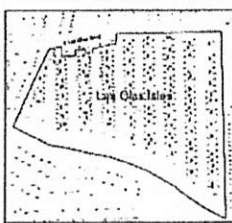

Underground Utility Line Assessments will be collected by the Broward County Tax Collector on the ad valorem tax bill for a period of 30 years, commencing with the tax bill to be mailed in November 2023. 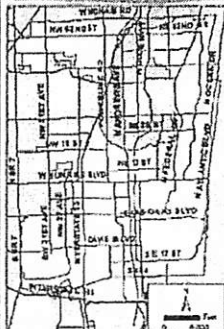

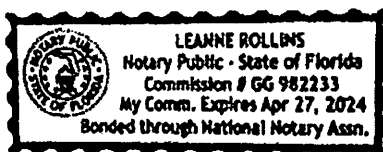
