Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission consider an ordinance amending the City of Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinance Chapter Fourteen Floodplain Management to comply with Florida Building Code (FBC) 2023 (8th Edition) requirements and to continue eligibility for FEMA Community Rating System (CRS) flood insurance discounts greater than 10 percent.

Background

The Florida Building Code 2023 (8th Edition) will take effect on December 31, 2023. Code references to the FBC in the local ordinance require updating to remain valid. Amendments to the City's Floodplain Management ordinance will require that manufactured homes installed or replaced in Special Flood Hazard Areas be elevated to at least the base flood elevation plus one (1) foot; add language to allow staff to utilize FEMA publications, to include but not limited to, FEMA Technical Bulletins when necessary as they change from time to time; and to clarify the use of nonstructural fill in Special Flood Hazard Areas and Non-Special Flood Hazard Areas. Language regarding mobile homes is being required by the FEMA CRS program for property owners citywide to continue to remain eligible for flood insurance discounts greater than 10 percent.
