Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the purchase of NetMotion software from the lowest cost, responsive and responsible bidder, AT&T Mobility National Accounts LLC, in the amount of \$95,819.75

Background

On February 19, 2013, the City Commission approved the purchase of system hardware and software to implement advanced authentication for Police mobile laptops, which was a State mandated requirement by September, 2013. At that time, the Information Technology Services Department was researching and evaluating pricing for the technology designed to allow for the necessary remote access (NetMotion Virtual Private Network – VPN). This is the same technology currently in use by other City departments.

This purchase will include a required update to the Police remote access approach to use a Netmotion Virtual Private Network (VPN) that is compatible both with two-factor authentication as well as standard single-factor authentication. This will allow users accessing FDLE resources to use two-factor authentication while users limited to systems with less stringent requirements may use single factor authentication.

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$95,819.75.
