## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approved the attached settlement and release regarding the litigation West Yard Partners, LLC, et al. vs. City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, et.al.

## Background

The nature of this litigation involves a dispute between the parties emanating from the City's enforcement of the Florida Building Code and Florida Fire Prevention Code at the Lauderdale Marine Center (LMC). LMC disputes the efficacy of the City's efforts in this effort and as a result did not compensate the City for certain costs incurred on their behalf.

During the period of November 26, 2010 through April 14, 2011 the City performed 494.25 hours of fire watch services (operations) at LMC. Additionally during this period Fire Prevention personnel performed 31 hours of service at the property relating to LMC's operations. These services were provided to LMC at \$126,247.87 in costs (labor costs - \$86,707.87; equipment costs - \$39,540). LMC had paid \$56,930.00 towards the costs, leaving a remaining balance of \$69,317.57. Under the proposed settlement agreement LMC will remit \$39,187.70 and the City will write off \$30,129.87, representing approximately 75% of the equipment costs.

The lawsuit also names former Fire Marshal David Raines. The proposed settlement agreement will also resolve all claims against him.
