Execute All Grant Agreements with the Federal Aviation Administration and All Associated Documents with the Grant Agreements and Authorize the City Manager to Accept Grant Funds on Behalf of the City – (Commission

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution delegating authority to the City Manager to approve and execute all grant agreements, contracts, modifications, extensions, and amendments to grant agreements and all associated documents with the grant agreements between the City and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and also authorize the City Manager to accept grant funds on behalf of the City, subject to the review and approval of all documents by the City Attorney or Assistant City Attorney prior to the City Manager's execution.

The City has accepted millions of dollars from the Federal Government in previous years for improvements at the Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport (FXE). The FAA requires that the City execute grant agreements urgently and the City staff does not want the City to lose the ability to obtain these funds from the federal government as these funds play an important role in the continuous development of FXE.

Recently the City became eligible for a grant from the FAA for the Design of Runway 9-27 Pavement Rehabilitation in the amount of \$511,874.00 at FXE.

Background

The Runway 9-27 Pavement Rehabilitation project is required as part of the Airport's approved Airport Layout Plan (ALP) to improve the current pavement condition of Runway 9-27 and taxiway intersections. Runway 9-27 is currently in poor condition with an area weighted Pavement Condition Index (PCI) value of 50 per Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Airport Pavement Evaluation Report of Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport (FXE).

The 2023 FDOT pavement evaluation report recommended Runway 9-27 be milled and overlayed with P-401 asphalt and full-depth reconstruction in some areas. The existing asphalt on Runway 9-27 was rehabilitated in 2004. The approximate total area for

pavement rehabilitation is approximately 650,000 square feet. The project is programmed within the Airport's current ALP and will strengthen the pavement condition of Runway 9-27.

The scope of the design of the project includes civil and electrical plans, geotechnical study, survey, and environmental services. The scope also includes permitting and grant coordination efforts.

The FAA has agreed to provide grant funding in the amount of \$511,874 for reimbursement of eligible design costs for this project. The Florida Department of Transportation provided a grant in the amount of \$25,000 for the projected costs and the Airport will provide the remaining balance in the amount of \$41,058, which is available in the project balance.

Staff recommends that the City Commission delegate authority to the City Manager to approve and execute all FAA grant agreements, contracts, modifications, extensions, and amendments to grant agreements and all associated documents with the grant agreements between the FAA or the federal government, and authorize the City Manager to accept grant funds on behalf of the City, subject to the review and approval of all documents by the City Attorney or Assistant City Attorney prior to their execution by the City Manager.

Resource Impact

There is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City for the recent grant in the amount of \$511,874 for the projected costs. The Florida Department of Transportation provided a grant in the amount of \$25,000 for the projected costs. The Airport will provide the remaining match in the amount of \$41,058, which is available in the project balance.
