Re:	Fire Rescue and Emergency Medical Services ("EMS") Special Districts

In response to a communication from the Fire Rescue Advisory Committee, the City Commission requested that staff present options to the Mayor and City Commission regarding the implementation of a Fire Rescue and Emergency Medical Services ("EMS") taxing district as a potential funding source for EMS and fire rescue service in the City.

The term "taxing district" is used in this context to reference special districts established for the purpose of providing fire protection and firefighting services, rescue services, emergency medical services or any combination of the listed services. A "special district" is a unit of local government created for a special purpose for a limited geographic boundary and by general law, special act, local ordinance, or by rule of the Governor and Cabinet. There are 66 Special Districts in the State of Florida established for the purpose of providing fire protection and firefighting services, rescue services, emergency medical services or any combination of the listed services. A list is provided as Exhibit A. These districts are permitted to fund these services through ad valorem taxes, non-ad valorem assessment, user fees, grants, and donations.

Existing special districts for the provision of EMS, fire rescue services, or both have been created by one of five methods, however, there are currently only two methods available for the establishment of a special district for fire rescue and EMS service, the creation of a dependent special district or an Independent Fire Control District pursuant to Chapter 191, Florida Statutes. See Exhibit B for a table providing a comparison of these types of special districts. The following excerpt from the "Florida Special District Handbook" published by the Florida Commerce Division of Community Development, Bureau of Community Planning and Growth, Special District Accountability Program explains the general difference between a dependent district and an independent district.

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The following is an excerpt from Florida Commerce, *Florida Special District Handbook* (Oct. 2022, Revised July 2024), Pages 17-18.

### "The Status of Special Districts: "Dependent" and "Independent"

Special districts are classified as either "dependent" or "independent".

### Dependent Special District

A dependent special district meets at least one of the following criteria:

- The special district's governing body membership is identical to a single county or a single municipality's governing body membership. Although the membership is identical, the governing bodies are separate governing bodies.
- All members of the special district's governing body are appointed by the governing body of a single county or a single municipality.
- During their unexpired terms, the special district's governing body members are subject to removal at will by the governing body of a single county or a single municipality.
- The special district has a budget that requires approval through an affirmative vote by the governing body of a single county or a single municipality.
- The special district has a budget that can be vetoed by the governing body of a single county or a single municipality.

#### Independent Special District

An independent special district does not meet any of the dependent district criteria. A special district that includes more than one county is independent unless it lies wholly within the boundaries of a single municipality.

#### The Significance of the "Dependent" and "Independent" Status

 Generally, counties and municipalities are authorized to create only dependent special districts. A few exceptions exist, such as community development districts established under Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, that are smaller than 2,500 acres. - Certain dependent special districts may have their financial reports and audits included with those of their local governing authority, as opposed to paying for a separate stand-alone financial audit. This can be a cost-savings for dependent special districts. Independent special districts must report separately from municipalities and counties.
- A special district's classification may affect local millage caps. If a dependent special district has the authority to levy ad valorem taxes, its ad valorem millage must be added to the millage of the county or municipality that created it. The combined total of their millage rates must not exceed the millage cap set for the county or municipality.

An example of a dependent special district within the jurisdiction of the City of Fort Lauderdale is the Lauderdale Isles Water Management District and examples of independent special districts in the City are the Downtown Development Authority of the City of Fort Lauderdale and the Fort Lauderdale Housing Authority.

In terms of funding, special districts adopt their own budgets annually by resolution. The budget is to include total amounts available from taxation and other sources and must equal the total of appropriations for expenditures and reserves. The budget is adopted in a public hearing process like that of the City. The tax levies and budget of a dependent special district must be either contained within the general budget of the City or adopted concurrently with the City's budget and adopted at the City's budget hearing. The City may review the budget or tax levy of any special district located solely within its boundaries.
