**TITLE**: Resolution approving the consolidated budget amendment

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget.

# **Background**

Budget amendments are consolidated into one agenda item for consideration at the first meeting of each month.

Examples of recommended actions within the consolidated budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds;
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- transfer between capital projects;
- acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- · appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Operating Budget and Community Investment Plan by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

#### Fire-Rescue

# A. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – Urban Area Security Initiative Grant Program - \$179,869.90

The City was awarded a sub grant in the amount of \$179,869.90 from the City of Miami via the United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) for the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program, which does not require a match. Funds will be used towards Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training and equipment (\$20,000), enhancements, communication services, maintenance of the Emergency Operations Center (\$109,869.90), and training for the Regional Citizens Corp (\$50,000). The grant acceptance, CAM 13-1495, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$179,869.90 to facilitate the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program.

### **Parks and Recreation**

# B. Transfer between operating and capital budgets – General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund – Citywide Facilities Condition Assessment - \$300,000

The City is in the process of hiring a firm to conduct a citywide facilities condition assessment. This will enhance the City's ability to develop short, intermediate, and long term capital improvement strategies based on the needs of the community. It is recommended to move funding for this project into the operating general fund budget.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$300,000 to facilitate the completion of the Citywide Facilities Assessment survey.

#### Police

# C. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund - Waterways Assistance Program - \$65,700

The City was awarded \$30,000 from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) to fund various waterway improvement projects, such as the purchase of a marine law enforcement vessel, related equipment, and outboard motors. The total cost of this project is \$65,700, of which the grant will fund \$30,000 and the remaining balance will be funded through budgeted grant match funds in the General Fund. The grant acceptance, CAM 13-1512, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$65,700 to facilitate the various waterway improvement projects.

# D. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund- Substance Abuse Prevention Program; no match required - \$90,000

The City was awarded \$90,000 from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to fund the Substance Abuse Prevention Program. The program will provide 28 weeks (1,680 hours) of group instruction, 40 hours of anti-drug presentations, 3 day-long field trips and individual tracking for 160 students attending William Dandy and Sunrise Middle Schools. This grant does not require a match. The grant acceptance, CAM 13-1517, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$90,000 to facilitate the Substance Abuse Prevention Program.

### **Public Works**

# E. Appropriation from fund balance – Water and Sewer Debt Financed Construction Non-Regional and Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Funds – Reconciliation of capital project budgets - \$1,644,682.71

Staff has evaluated funded, active projects and found several projects with overspent budgets. To facilitate balanced project budgets for capital projects, a transfer of funds is recommended from the appropriate fund balances. The overspent projects are a result of a lag in postings between expenditures. To prevent this from occurring in the future, enhancements to the accounting process have been implemented.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts of the various funds in the amount of \$1,644,682.71 to re-balance the projects.

# F. Transfer between operating and capital budgets – General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund – Bridges Master Plan Assessment - \$250,000

The City will conduct a comprehensive condition assessment of all citywide bridges. This will enhance the City's ability to develop short, intermediate, and long term capital improvement strategies based on the condition of the bridges and needs of the community. Funding was previously approved as a capital project, but the funding is recommended to be moved into the operating general fund budget.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$250,000 to facilitate

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the completion of the Bridges Master Plan Assessment.

# G. Transfer between capital budgets – Fire Rescue Bond Fund – Temporary Fire Station 54 - \$110,549.42

The City Commission approved the land lease and the purchase of a modular facility for the Temporary Fire Station 54 at the May 21, 2013 meeting (CAM 13-0720). To finalize the project, utilities (drainage, water, sewer, electrical, phone and data) and paving work needs to be installed. The estimated cost of the installation is approximately \$110,549.42, which includes the engineering fees. Funding to complete the temporary fire station is recommended to be transferred from a completed project. The contract award, CAM 13-1111, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Fire Rescue Bond Fund in the amount of \$110,549.42 to facilitate the Temporary Fire Station 54 project.

# H. Transfer between operating and capital budgets - General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund – Wind Turbines at Mills Pond Park - \$16,745

The City recently purchased four (4) vertical axis wind turbines and four (4) electric vehicle charging stations through a grant. The cost of the wind turbines did not include installation. The estimated cost is approximately \$33,745; however, some funds are available and only \$16,745 is needed to complete the installation.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund and General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$16,745 to facilitate the installation of the four vertical axis wind turbines at Mills Pond Park.

### **Sustainable Development**

# I. Appropriation from fund balance – Building Permit Fund – Replacement of emergency generator - \$84,000

A load test was conducted of the generator located outside the Department of Sustainable Development (DSD) building. During the testing, the generator caught fire and sustained substantial damages. The generator was considered a total loss after several inspections by the insurance adjustors and the fire inspectors. The generator is a critical piece of equipment as it is the main source of electricity in the event of a power outage. Replacement of the generator costs approximately \$84,000, which will be reimbursed by the insurance carrier. The award contract, CAM 13-1574, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by

amending the appropriate accounts in the Building Permit Fund in the amount of \$84,000 to facilitate the replacement of the emergency generator for the Department of Sustainable Development's building.

# J. Appropriation from fund balance - Community Redevelopment Agency Fund and General Fund - Wave Streetcar - \$1,000,000

A funding contribution in the amount of \$1,000,000 is due to the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) for the Wave Streetcar. The Community Redevelopment Agency's (CRA) annual contribution is 27.6% each year since a portion of the route is within the Northwest Progresso boundaries. In FY 2013, the CRA's contribution was 27.6% of \$1.1MM (\$303,600) and in FY 2014 that amount is \$276,000. The total amount of \$579,600 is due to the SFRTA for both years. The balance of the payment of \$420,400 will be paid from the General Fund. The funding contribution was approved by the CRA board at its November 19, 2013 meeting, CAM 13-1465.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Community Redevelopment Agency Fund and General Fund in the amount of \$1,000,000 to facilitate the contribution to the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority.

# K. Appropriation from fund balance – Community Redevelopment Agency Fund – Progresso Village Enhancement Project- \$300,000

The City of Fort Lauderdale entered into a Joint Participation Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation to complete much needed improvements, such as construction of sidewalks, roadway resurfacing, modification of drainage system, reconstruction of swales, tree planting, installation of irrigation system and pedestrian lights in the Progresso area. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$900,000. Florida Department of Transportation provided a grant in the amount of \$300,000 and the City Commission approved an appropriation for \$300,000 as a cash match to the project at the January 7, 2012 City Commission meeting (CAM 12-0019). The remaining balance of \$300,000 will be funded from the fund balance. The CRA Board approved the use of the funds at its November 19, 2013, CAM 13-1465.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Northwest Progresso Flagler Heights CRA CIP Fund in the amount of \$300,000 for the Progresso Neighborhood Improvements project.

### **Transportation and Mobility**

# L. Appropriation to fund balance – Airport Fund - De-appropriation of capital projects – \$700,875

Several projects adopted by the City Commission in the Five-Year Community Investment Plan (CAM 13-1214) at the September 3, 2013 City Commission meeting are no longer prioritized as an immediate need. Staff recommends that the funding previously appropriated to these projects be transferred to the fund balance and made available to fund other priorities. These projects will be closed upon the transference of their balances. It is recommended that funding for projects: Design and Construct Perimeter Roads - \$229,375 and Security Annex at the Executive Airport - \$471,500 be de-appropriated and transferred to the fund balance.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Airport Fund in the amount of \$700,875 to de-appropriate the Design and Construct Perimeter Roads project (229,375) and the Security Annex. Project (\$471,500) and to transfer the balances to the fund balance for other priority projects.

# M. Appropriation from fund balance – Airport Fund – Earthwork Project – \$3,759,366.74

Several parcels located in the Fort Lauderdale Industrial Airpark have recently been cleared and established as natural areas. To enhance the development potential of these properties, the land grade needs to be increased to an elevation of 8 feet. A cost estimate to increase the land elevation of three parcels (Parcels B, C, and D) is approximately \$3,759,366.74.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Airport Fund in the amount of \$3,759,366.74 to facilitate the Earthwork Project on Parcels B, C, and D.

# N. Appropriation from fund balance – Airport Fund –Taxilane Charlie Pavement Rehabilitation – \$53,750.88

Pavement rehabilitation for Taxilane Charlie was approved July 2, 2013 by the City Commission (CAM 13-0821). The design of the project is complete and construction will begin. Engineering and project inspection will be conducted by City staff which is estimated at \$53,750.88. The contract award, CAM 13-1373, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Airport Fund in the amount of \$53,750.88 for the engineering inspection services provided

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during the construction of the Taxilane Charlie pavement rehabilitation project.

# O. Appropriation from fund balance – Airport Fund – U.S. Customs & Border Protection Facility – \$924,185.00

The U.S Customs and Border Protection Facility is scheduled to be constructed at the Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport. The facility will also be designed to achieve Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver certification by the United States Green Building Council (USGBC). The supplemental joint participation agreement was approved at the November 5, 2013, City Commission meeting (CAM 13-1386). The lowest bid received on the project was estimated at \$5,689,000. Additional funding is needed to offset the cost of the facility in the amount of \$924,185. The contract award, CAM 13-1462, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in Airport Fund in the amount of \$924,185.00 for the construction of the U.S. Customs and Border Protection Facility.

# P. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – General Fund - Funding for the Transportation Management Association (TMA) Agreement - \$303,804.75

The City operates a community bus service through the Downtown Fort Lauderdale Transportation Management Association (TMA) to Fort Lauderdale and surrounding areas. Partial funding for the TMA's Sun Trolley is provided from different sources, including Broward County. For the 2014 fiscal year, the Broward County contribution towards the TMA's FY 2014 budget totals \$303,804.75, which will be appropriated to the TMA Bus Routes. This funding comes through the City as a pass-through, with no fiscal impact to the City.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund in the amount of \$303,804.75 for the Broward County contribution towards the TMA Agreement.
