TITLE: Motion to Approve and Execute Task Order No. 4 with Kittelson &

Associates, Inc., in the amount of \$84,250, for Multimodal Transportation

Plan

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve Task Order #4 with Kittelson & Associates, Inc., in the amount of \$84,250, for the Multimodal Transportation Plan.

Background

City staff has been developing a Citywide Multimodal Connectivity Map that includes pedestrian, bicycle, transit access, complete street elements, and other multimodal infrastructure improvements to provide access for all modes of transportation on our roadway network. Staff presented the initial map to the Commission at its meeting on May 15, 2012. Since obtaining approval to proceed with this effort, staff has conducted extensive public outreach via workshops to understand the desires of the community and how that fits into the Multimodal Connectivity Map.

The next step is to develop a detailed and prioritized list of improvements based upon the input received from the community that can be programmed into the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Work Program, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Transportation Improvement Plan, the City's Community Investment Plan, and use as a basis for grant applications.

In addition, a process for mitigating the transportation impacts of proposed developments focused on the implementation of the mobility projects and/or contributions to a fund dedicated to implementing the mobility projects is necessary.

On July 6, 2011, the City of Fort Lauderdale entered into an agreement with Kittelson & Associates, Inc., for Professional Transportation Consultant Services. For this task order, the consultant will study the City's transportation system and produce a Citywide Multimodal Transportation Plan that includes a prioritized list of projects, funding plan,

as well as a transportation mitigation process for development. Task Work Order #4 is attached for reference (Exhibit1).

Resource Impact

There is a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$84,250. Funding for this item is available in FY13 budget.
