TITLE: Resolution Rescinding Resolution 17-14 Adopting the Existing Street
Name of Seven Isles Drive (NE/SE 23rd Avenue) between Las Olas
Boulevard and Desota Drive

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution rescinding Resolution 17-14, relating to the secondary naming of NE/SE 23rd Avenue.

Background

On January 18, 2017, the City Commission approved Resolution 17-14 adopting the existing street name of Seven Isles Drive (NE/SE 23rd Avenue). The purpose of passing the resolution was to formally adopt the street name. By formalizing, the postmaster can recognize the street name and Broward County, as the maintaining agency of traffic signage, can maintain the signs.

After forwarding the resolution to Broward County and the Postmaster, an issue was raised with the numbering of addresses by making the change. In addition, it was discovered that an ordinance was passed on February 3, 1987, Ordinance No. C-87-9 that states, "the street shall also be known as Seven Isles Dr." The 9-1-1 database only reflects the primary street name assigned by the municipality addressing authority and does not include aliases or secondary names.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Resolution be rescinded since the name was already formally adopted and because it avoids Postmaster and 9-1-1 issues.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this resolution.
