**TITLE:** Motion Approving Florida Department of Transportation Combating  
Aggressive Driving Program Funding - \$51,000 -(**Commission Districts  
1, 2, 3 and 4**)

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**Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission approve a subgrant agreement from the Florida Department of Transportation to assist the Fort Lauderdale Police Department (FLPD) in conducting a public awareness and enforcement campaign related to aggressive driving.

**Background**

In February 2025, the City applied to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) in response to a solicitation for proposals from law enforcement agencies to address the most significant traffic safety issues within their jurisdictions. The proposed campaign "Operation Fast and Furious," focuses on reducing incidents related to aggressive driving, which can lead to accidents involving serious injuries or fatalities. Aggressive driving behaviors include speeding, failure to yield to right-of-way, improper or unsafe lane changes, improper passing, following too closely or the failure to obey traffic control devices.

The City has been awarded \$51,000 in grant funding to institute an aggressive driving campaign to reduce the frequency of incidents in identified hot spots. To combat aggressive driving, a combination of enforcement and use of educational activities will be performed. In addition, funding can also be utilized to acquire speed measurement devices for the FLPD Motor Unit. The grant does not require matching funds and will end on September 30, 2026.

**Resource Impact**

There is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$51,000. This item is contingent upon the approval of the January 6, 2026 Consolidated Budget Amendment (CAM #25-1157).
