1, 2, 3 and 4)

## Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission reject all proposals received in response to Request for Qualifications (RFQ) No. 143 for Construction Engineering Inspection (CEI) Services for George T. Lohmeyer (GTL) Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Effluent Pumps, Standby Generators & Administration Building Improvements.

## **Background**

The Effluent Pumps Standby Generators & Administration Building Improvements project includes the installation of four (4) 3-megawatt generators, complete with fuel tanks, electrical switchgear, sound attenuation enclosures, and all appurtenances. Additionally, this project provides for construction of the generator pad(s), furnishing and installing new effluent pumps and motors, furnishing and installing electrical and HVAC equipment, and rehabilitation/expansion of the GTL WWTP administration building.

On August 1, 2023, the Procurement Services Division issued RFQ Event No. 143 for CEI Services for GTL WWTP Effluent Pumps, Standby Generators & Administration Building Improvements.

On September 8, 2023, the event closed and a total of two (2) firms submitted responses.

- R.J. Behar & Company, Inc.
- The Corradino Group, Inc.

The Corradino Group, Inc. submitted a no-bid response.

On October 10, 2023, the Evaluation Committee convened for a combination meeting to evaluate the single proposal received and hear a presentation based on the criteria defined in the RFQ document. The CEI services were intended to be utilized for the design-build services for construction of the Effluent Pumps Standby Generators and Administration Building Improvements.

On December 19, 2023, the City Commission approved the rejection of the single proposal received for design-build services for construction of the Effluent Pumps Standby Generators and Administration Building Improvements due to a declaration of an impasse as negotiations were unsuccessful. The single proposal was unwilling to negotiate their proposed amount of \$24,980,000, which was significantly higher than the estimated engineer's amount of \$15,000,000 (CAM #23-1112). City staff has now opted to advance the design to 100% completion (which is expected to minimize risk/built in contingencies for prospective proposers) and secure a contractor through the design-bid-build delivery method.

As a result of the December 19, 2023 action to reject the single proposal for the designbuild services, and the election to pursue design, bid, build delivery method, the required CEI services will be minimized and will be provided through existing annual contracts. As a result, RFQ No. 143 is no longer required.
