FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE FY2023-2024 PROGRAM PROVIDER AGREEMENT

WITH

LEGAL AID SERVICE OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.

THIS AMENDMENT, with an effective date of **October 1**st, **2024**, by the City of Fort Lauderdale, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (City), and **LEGAL AID SERVICE OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.**, a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Florida, with its usual place of business located 491 North State Road 7, Plantation, Florida 33317 (Participant).

WHEREAS, the City receives Housing for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to undertake activities, including housing and other supportive services to eligible individuals; and

WHEREAS, the City issued Request for Information (RFI) No. 12487-108 and the HOPWA grant application process through the submittable portal, seeking qualified non-profit organizations to provide certain supportive services to eligible persons under the HOPWA grant program; and

WHEREAS, Participant submitted a responsive proposal to the City to provide Housing Support Services Case Management; and

WHEREAS, the City approved the Annual Action Plan (CAM 23-0447) on June 20, 2023, which plan, in part awarded HOPWA funding to Participant; and

WHEREAS, Participant is a non-profit organization with significant activities related to providing services or housing to persons with Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS) or related diseases; and.

WHEREAS, the Participant requested a one-time extension of the Provider Agreement for an additional four (4) months, commencing October 1, 2024, and ending January 31, 2025, so it may continue the same level of services and other necessary actions intended for HOPWA Program qualified individuals.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

I. <u>RECITALS:</u> The foregoing recitals are true and correct in all respects and are incorporated herein by reference.

- II. <u>AMENDMENTS:</u> Article V, Section 5.1 of the Provider Agreement titled, "TERM AND TIME OF PERFORMANCE" is amended as follows:
 - **5.1** The contract term of the Provider Agreement is extended four (4) months from the end of the initial term which shall commence on October 1, 2024 and end on January 31, 2025, subject to any earlier termination provided in the Provider Agreement. This is a one-time extension for a period of four (4) months, with no additional term extensions or renewals. All allocations or reimbursements should be expensed within this extended term. If the Participant fails to meet any of the agreed upon expenditure terms, the City shall not be obligated to provide additional time extensions for allocations or reimbursements.
- III. NO OTHER CHANGES: Except as modified by this First Amendment, all other terms, covenants, obligations and provisions of the Provider Agreement shall remain unaltered, shall continue in full force and effect, and are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed by the parties in every respect. If the terms and conditions set forth in this First Amendment directly conflict with any provision contained in the Provider Agreement, then this First Amendment shall control.

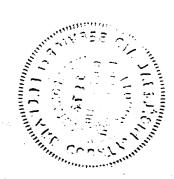

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve the 2023-2024 Annual Action Plan and funding allocation as proposed by the Community Services Board (CSB), and authorize the City Manager to execute the documents and agreements, that are necessary and incidental to each entitlement funding source for submittal to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Background

The City is required to submit an annual action plan associated with the five-year consolidated plan for 2020-2024. The consolidated plan provides a comprehensive strategy on how the City will use the entitlement funding to address housing, economic, social and community development needs. The attached annual action plan identifies specific activities with allocated funding amounts that are designed to achieve the goals identified in the consolidated plan.

The annual action planning process serves as the framework that has been established based on community-wide dialogues. These dialogues identify Commission top priorities that align with the consolidated plan and support the HUD national objective for: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA), and HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program. Exhibit 2 provides a comprehensive outline of the community organizations to be funded, the proposed funding amount and a brief description of the program and services to be provided.

There is no known fiscal impact associated with this action.
