TITLE: Resolution—Special Assessment Liens for Cost Associated with Lot

Clearing and Cleaning

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the imposition of Special Assessment Liens for the costs associated with cleaning and removal of debris of properties listed in **Exhibit 1**, and direct the proper city staff to record a notice of special assessment lien in the public records of Broward County.

Background

In accordance with City Commission Resolution 11-14 (**Exhibit 2**), the City is required to assess against properties described in the attached report the cost and expense of lot clearing and impose a special assessment lien against each property for the assessed amount.

The properties in the attached list were found to be overgrown and unkempt with trash and debris existing therein. Notice was provided to the owners to clear the lots within the required ten-day timeframe. After the property owners failed to comply, the City cleared and cleaned the properties. Bills totaling \$67,673.68 have been sent to the owners and to date have not been paid.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
