<u>Purpose:</u> To preserve the artform of creating dugout canoes by organizing an annual Paddle Up featuring Seminole and Miccosukee canoes with participants in traditional attire.

Grant Activities:

- * Create an annual "Paddle-Up" tradition on the Himmarshee Canal to feature dug-out canoes from the Miccosukee and Seminole Tribe together with a flash mob of people on paddle boards, kayaks and canoes;
- * Feature tribal members in traditional patchwork garments and educate attendees as to what patchwork is and how it is unique to this area and these tribes;
- * Host live demonstrations by traditional artist Pedro Zepeda of the Seminole Tribe, building a dugout cance from a cypress log;
- * Offer guided tours by project director and lead artist.
- * Blog entries quarterly including two videos by posting to artsblog@knightfoundation.org.

<u>Anticipated Outcomes:</u> The following description represents your organization's expectations for the outcomes of the funded project. - * Highlight the history of the original inhabitants in an environmentally sensitive event that brings people and attention to the canal as well as the urban hammock;
- * Renew interest among tribal members to utilize their traditional craft and to think imaginatively of how their traditions can be incorporated in the global community;
- * Strengthen relationships between the two tribes and to Fort Lauderdale;
- * Increase interest in the Las Olas Village area, an area currently in urban blight and decay;
- * Increase awareness of indigenous design and its connection to the region.
