

**In Recognition of  
Fire Prevention Week  
October 5-11, 2014**

- WHEREAS,** the City of Fort Lauderdale is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our city; and
- WHEREAS,** fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and
- WHEREAS,** home fires killed more than 2,300 people in the United States in 2012, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and fire departments in the United States responded to 365,000 home fires; and
- WHEREAS,** working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and
- WHEREAS,** three out of five of home fire deaths result from fires in properties without working smoke alarms; and
- WHEREAS,** in one-fifth of all homes with smoke alarms, none were working; and
- WHEREAS,** when smoke alarms should have operated but did not do so it was usually because batteries were missing, disconnected, or dead; and
- WHEREAS,** Fort Lauderdale residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and
- WHEREAS,** Fort Lauderdale's residents should install smoke alarms and alert devices that meet the needs of people who are deaf or hard of hearing; and
- WHEREAS,** Fort Lauderdale's residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive a fire; and
- WHEREAS,** our firefighters are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and
- WHEREAS,** Fort Lauderdale residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and
- WHEREAS,** the 2014 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives: Test Yours Every Month!" effectively serves to remind us that we need working smoke alarms to give us the time to get out safely.

**NOW THEREFORE, WE,** as City Commissioners of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, do hereby proclaim **October 5-11, 2014** as:

**Fire Prevention Week**

in the City of Fort Lauderdale and urge all of our neighbors to test their smoke alarms at least every month by pushing the test button, and to support the all of the public safety activities and efforts of Fort Lauderdale Fire-Rescue during Fire Prevention Week 2014.
