TITLE: Resolution Authorizing Budget Amendment – Reappropriate \$190,000 for Environmental Studies - **(Commission District 3)**

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Board of Commissioners approve the transfer of \$190,000 from the Development Incentive Improvement Program funds to the Northwest Progresso Flagler Heights (NPF) CRA Operating budget.

Background

On May 17, 2022, the CRA Board adopted a resolution to accept the instruments of conveyance of fifteen (15) properties from the City of Fort Lauderdale for affordable housing, contract with companies for appraisals, title, survey, demolition, maintenance, and related services. All fifteen properties are located in the NPF CRA area and require environmental studies to determine whether the land has any environmental issues such as contaminated soils or polluted water sources.

A transfer of CRA Development Incentive Improvement Program funds is needed to cover costs of the environmental studies. The CRA intends to order research for phase I and phase II for an estimated cost of \$190,000.
