**TITLE**: Proprietary purchase of services and parts to repair hydrotreator number

one at the Fiveash Water Treatment Plant (Fiveash) – \$704,235

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the proprietary purchase of services and parts for refurbishing hydrotreator number one Fiveash from Ovivo USA, LLC. (Ovivo) in substantially the form of proposal attached at a cost of \$704,235.

### **Background**

A hydrotreator is a tank where the incoming water is mixed with lime and then allowed to calm so the water passage slows down and allows the suspended particles to settle in the bottom of the tank. This process then results in the removal of the hardness in the water.

Hydrotreator number one at Fiveash became non-operational on September 4, 2014. The rotating assembly of the unit structurally failed and broke, rendering the unit non-operational (Exhibit 2). This unit produced approximately ten millions of gallons of water per day and is essential to meeting maximum day demands and fire flows.

The cost for the repair of the unit is \$704,235 from Ovivo, the sole source vendor approved by the City Commission on September 16, 2014 (CAM 14-1203).

# **Resource Impact:**

There is a fiscal impact in the amount of \$704,235. Funding for this item is contingent upon the November 4, 2014 consolidated budget amendment CAM 14-1224.
