A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FINAL OPERATING BUDGET OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2013, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2014, BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS AS SET FORTH IN CITY COMMISSION AGENDA MEMO #13-1623 AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

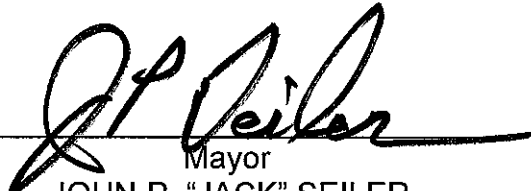
WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 13-168, adopted on September 12, 2013, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale adopted the Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2013, and ending September 30, 2014,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:


SECTION 1. That the Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2013, and ending September 30, 2014, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in Commission Agenda Memo #13-1623, copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

**TITLE:** Resolution approving the consolidated budget amendment

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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget.

**Background**

Budget amendments are consolidated into one agenda item for consideration at the first meeting of each month.

Examples of recommended actions within the consolidated budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds;
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- transfer between capital projects;
- acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Operating Budget and Community Investment Plan by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

## Police Department

### **A. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund - Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Countywide Solicitation Grant (Byrne/JAG) Program - \$49,496**

The City has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$49,496 from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant to support the continuation of Operation Trend Buster. Funds will be used towards overtime, salaries, vehicle rental, training conference attendance and supplies to support investigative, enforcement and vendor education activities. The primary goal of the grant program is to reduce the availability of marijuana, alcohol, and tobacco products sold to youths by targeting local vendors who make those products accessible to minors. The grant acceptance, CAM 13-1650, is a companion item on the agenda.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$49,496 to facilitate the continuation of Operation Trend Buster.

### **B. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund - Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Local Solicitation Grant (Byrne/JAG) Program - \$92,507**

Each year the City receives an allocation of funds from the U.S. Department of Justice under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (Byrne/JAG) Program. The City was recently notified that it was approved for \$99,716 in Byrne/JAG funds, less a 7.23% administrative fee of \$7,209 imposed by the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO), for a net total of \$92,507. The City will utilize the grant funds to assist in the refurbishment of the mobile command vehicle and to upgrade technological equipment. The grant acceptance, CAM 13-1666, is a companion item on the agenda.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$92,507 to facilitate the refurbishment of the mobile command vehicle and technology upgrades.

## Public Works

### **C. Appropriation from fund balance and appropriation to the operating budget – Water and Sewer General Capital Projects, Water and Sewer Operations, and Stormwater Funds – Work orders for the Annual Utilities Restoration Contract - \$584,661.25**

The City Commission approved the annual utilities contract on August 20, 2013 (CAM 13-0722) in an amount up to \$749,830. This funding is used to outsource large repairs when needed. Currently City crews make small improvements, repairs, and maintenance on these sewer systems. There are several water and sewer mains, and

storm drains that are in need of repair that cannot be completed by the City crews. Funding to complete these projects is recommended to be transferred from fund balances and from the annual utilities restoration project. The work orders 5 and 6 requests are companion items on the agenda, CAM 13-1683.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Water and Sewer General Capital Projects, Water and Sewer Operations, and Stormwater Funds in the amount of \$584,662.25 to facilitate the repairs and maintenance of various water, sewer and stormwater systems.

**D. Appropriation from fund balance – Water and Sewer Debt Financed Construction Non-Regional and Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Funds – Reconciliation of capital project budgets - \$825,515**

Staff has evaluated funded, active projects and found several projects with overspent budgets. To facilitate balanced project budgets for capital projects, a transfer of funds is recommended from the appropriate fund balances. The overspent projects are a result of a lag in postings between expenditures. To prevent this from occurring in the future, enhancements to the accounting process have been implemented.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts to the various funds in the amount of \$825,515 to re-balance the projects.

**E. Transfer between capital projects - Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund – Prospect Wellfield Pump/Motor Assemblies - \$185,000**

The Prospect Wellfield has 29 active wells that supply raw water for treatment to the Fiveash Water Treatment Plant. The well pumps and motors require continuous, ongoing maintenance year round and spare assemblies are required in order to provide fast turnaround when an assembly fails. This funding is for the purchase of two (2) complete pump/motor assemblies to be used as spares in the event of a failure of an installed unit. The spare pump/motor assemblies will allow maintenance staff to restore service within hours of a breakdown. Failure to fund this purchase will result in significant delays in the repair of failed units due to the extended lead times associated with the acquisition of the replacement equipment.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Water and Sewer General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$185,000 to facilitate the purchase of two complete pump/motor assemblies.

**F. Transfer between capital projects – General Capital Projects Fund – Sidewalk Management System - \$159,201**

Staff is recommending purchase approval of a Sidewalk Management System. This electronic database includes a dashboard using iOS 7, software to access the current sidewalk condition matrix, field work preparation, field inspection, field quality control, GPS to GIS data conversion, and sidewalk defect identification for approximately 425 miles of City sidewalks. The interactive database will be used to schedule, update and track current and future, new and existing sidewalk restoration and construction. The task order to approve the sidewalk management system will be presented to the City Commission on January 22, 2014 (CAM 14-0067).

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts General Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$159,201 to purchase the Sidewalk Management System.

**G. Appropriation from fund balance and between capital projects – Water and Sewer General Capital Projects and General Capital Projects Funds – Improvements, Repairs & Maintenance - \$230,986**

On November 27, 2013 bids were received for an annual contract for bridge repair, maintenance and painting. The citywide bridge restoration work includes: 1) repair of all concrete spalling by removing all unsound concrete, cleaning and treating all corroded rebar, and reforming structures to the original shape; 2) removing and replacing all deteriorated expansion joints; and 3) injecting flowable fill at all locations indicated by the City Engineer. Estimated cost of the improvements and repairs are \$230,986, which include engineering fees. The annual bridge repair contract, CAM 13-1696, will be presented to the City Commission on January 22, 2014.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 Community Investment Plan (CIP) and Budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the various funds in the amount of \$230,986 to complete repair and maintenance necessary to restore the City's bridges.

**Sustainable Development**

**H. Appropriation from fund balance – Building Permit Fund – Board-Up Services for Unsafe Structures - \$136,775**

The annual contract services for board-ups will consist of the securing and boarding of approximately sixty (60) unsafe structures per year. City staff will determine if a structure is unsafe and poses a risk to neighbors. An initial budget of \$38,225 was established for the board-up services until a formal bid process could be conducted. Staff conducted a request for proposal (RFP) and based on the responses, a budget of \$175,000 is reasonable to accommodate board-up services for a minimum of 60 structures using shatter resistant polycarbonate materials. Additional funding in the amount of \$136,775

is recommended to contract for these services. The contract for services, CAM 14-0029, will be presented to the City Commission at the January 22, 2014 meeting.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Building Permits Fund in the amount of \$136,775 to facilitate the annual contract for the board-up services.

### **Transportation and Mobility**

#### **I. Appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures – General Fund – Community Bus Fare Increase - \$60,000**

The City Commission approved a transit fare policy and increased the fare rates for three of the community bus routes: Beach Link, Las Olas Link, and Galt Link. This increase from \$.50 to \$1.00 for a regular one-way fare will generate approximately \$60,000 in additional revenue, which will be collected by the Transportation Management Association (TMA). The fare increase was approved at the December 17, 2014 City Commission meeting (CAM 13-1562).

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the General Fund in the amount of \$60,000 to facilitate the additional revenue from the increased transit fare costs.

#### **J. Acceptance and appropriation of grant funding – Grants Fund – Sun Trolley Community Bus Service (FTA New Freedom Grant) - \$564,841**

The City was awarded the Federal Transportation Administration (FTA) New Freedom grant as a sub-recipient totaling \$564,841 of which \$356,841 will be used for operating costs of the bus service associated with the Northwest/Tri-Rail and Neighborhood Links, and \$208,000 for consultant services. A soft match of 20% is required from toll revenue credits and an additional 50% match is required for the operating costs to be provided by the Transportation Management Association (TMA). The grant acceptance, CAM 14-0018, is a companion item on this agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2014 operating budget by amending the appropriate accounts in the Grants Fund in the amount of \$564,841 to facilitate the FTA New Freedom grant.
