Resolution Approving the Final Consolidated Budget Amendment to Fiscal Year 2019 - Appropriation - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

In response to Vice Mayor McKinzie's question regarding the Budget Amendment item related to the Department of Sustainable Development's (DSD) Building Fund Balance (Fund), City Manager Lagerbloom explained the impact of recent State legislation (House Bill 447) addressing the amount of money that could be retained in the Fund. The balance cannot exceed the four-year rolling average of what it costs to operate the Fund. Fund dollars currently exceed the four-year rolling average. This item programs a portion of the Fund into a capital project while Staff works towards compliance with the recent legislation. City Manager Lagerbloom expounded on related details.

In response to Vice Mayor McKinzie's question regarding use for staffing, City Manager Lagerbloom confirmed that amounts expended from the Fund can be used for spending in furtherance of the Florida Building Code. Vice Mayor McKinzie confirmed his desire to delve into this topic at a later date.

Vice Mayor McKinzie inquired about the status of the Sweeting Estates Dock. City Manager Lagerbloom said all recently received bids had been more than anticipated. Vice Mayor McKinzie commented on his perspective, citing procedures and stating current bids would be higher than those received three years ago. Further comment ensued. City Manager Lagerbloom confirmed this budget amendment would serve to ensure the completion of the Sweeting Estates Dock. Vice Mayor McKinzie noted the need to address all docks. City Manager Lagerbloom acknowledged this need.

Commissioner Glassman inquired about Budget Amendment item "E" relating to the Arts and Science Garage (Garage) Fund, recognizing the City's partnership with Broward County and the Performing Arts Center Authority (Partnership). He discussed input received from families regarding the cost of Garage parking when attending downtown events, noting the need to start a conversation about implementing a reduced residential parking fee. City Manager Lagerbloom commented on the Partnership and its impact regarding the ability to set Garage rates. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Commissioner Sorensen introduced this Resolution which was read by title only.

Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 736 NE 20th Avenue for the Installation of One Triple Mooring Pile Cluster and Two Single Mooring Piles - (Commission District 2)

Mayor Trantalis opened the public hearing.

Mayor Trantalis recognized David Nutter, B&M Marine Construction, Inc., on behalf of the applicant. Mr. Nutter spoke in support of this item, explaining details regarding the request for mooring pilings. The request does not exceed similar previously granted waivers. At the request of the Marine Advisory Board (MAB), the project was reduced by three (3) feet from the wet face of the seawall.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Priscilla Juranitch, 714 NE 20th Avenue. Ms. Juranitch spoke in opposition to this item. She commented on a waiver previously granted at 704 NE 20th Avenue, emphasizing that this area is residential and noting discussions at the MAB Meeting. Ms. Juranitch commented on her understanding that the owner was not planning to reside at 736 NE 20th Avenue (upland parcel), the possible future mooring of two yachts and the structure on the upland parcel being utilized as a yacht support building. She expounded on the nature of the neighborhood and marine-related details and concerns.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Charles King, 105 N. Victoria Park Road. Mr. King spoke in opposition to this item, commenting on the actions of the previous Commission on this topic and the lack of applicant interaction with impacted neighborhoods.

Commissioner Glassman commented on site visits to this area over the past year and the creation of the current situation. He voiced his concern regarding these types of waivers of limitations and applications not going before impacted neighborhood associations. He discussed this area being zoned RS-8, commenting on associated concerns related to violations and citing examples of zoning restrictions.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question regarding zoning violations, Assistant City Attorney Bob Dunckel explained a provision in this Resolution stating, *Use of the dock to which the mooring piles are appurtenant shall be limited to the owner or tenant in possession of the upland Property*. Mr. Dunckel said it is the responsibility of Staff to enforce this provision, stating that a vessel cannot be birthed in such a manner that it encroaches into an extension of the side-yard setbacks.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question regarding the term *tenant* in the Resolution, Assistant City Attorney Dunckel explained it is the *tenant of the upland property*.

Commissioner Glassman commented on the situation as it relates to the Zoning Code of Ordinances. Assistant City Attorney Dunckel reiterated

the dock could not be rented independent of having a possessory interest in the upland parcel.

Commissioner Glassman said commercial traffic should not be generated by anyone other than those who occupy upland parcels, noting that a marina has been created. Commissioner Glassman expounded on his position regarding this type of activity occurring in this residential neighborhood and the need to address.

In response to Commissioner Sorensen's questions, Assistant City Attorney Dunckel reiterated the area is zoned RS-8. It is not legal to rent a dock independent of a possessory interest in the upland parcel. With regard to yacht rentals, there must be a nexus between an ownership interest or possessory interest in the upland parcel and the ownership interest in a yacht.

Assistant City Attorney Dunckel commented on painting and refurbishment work done on vessels, stating a need to address Code concerns, i.e., its overly broad nature and the need for enforcement, expounding on details.

Commissioner Glassman confirmed the need for future discussion, commenting on the condition of the structure located on the upland parcel and concerns related to Ordinance violations. Assistant City Attorney Dunckel clarified that *possessory interest* means living at a property. Commissioner Glassman said this is not what is occurring.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Nutter confirmed Gerhard Sowa is the owner of the Canadian trust,147646 Limited, that owns the parcel.

City Attorney Alain Boileau commented on concerns regarding documented representation of Mr. Sowa by Mr. Nutter, expounding on details. Discussions ensued on Mr. Sowa occupying the upland parcel. Mr. Nutter said Mr. Sowa stays in a hotel when in the area. Further comment and discussion ensued on the structure located on the upland parcel. Mr. Nutter said the vessel located at the property is owned by Mr. Sowa. Any additional vessels located at this dock would be owned by Mr. Sowa. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mayor Trantalis commented on his concerns, including vessels moored at this location being owned by a corporate entity. Discussion ensued on the topic of qualifying possessory interest in a property. City Attorney Boileau noted the need for additional information. Vice Mayor McKinzie commented on corporate entities qualifying for a Homestead Exemption.

It was noted that corporations do not qualify for a Homestead Exemption. A trust could qualify for a Homestead Exemption.

There being no one else wishing to speak on this item, Vice Mayor McKinzie made a motion to close the public hearing which was seconded by Commissioner Glassman. Roll call showed: AYES: Commissioner Sorensen, Commissioner Glassman, Vice Mayor McKinzie, and Mayor Trantalis. NAYS: None.

Further comment and discussion ensued on the need for additional clarification and information. Mayor Trantalis commented on concerns regarding the extension of docks into the waterway. Commissioner Glassman concurred, noting the need to revisit this issue. He confirmed his opposition to a deferral. City Attorney Boileau explained procedural actions regarding Commission action. Commissioner Glassman explained his perspective regarding a deferral, expounding on details related to this item coming back before the Commission.

Commissioner Glassman made a motion to deny the waiver of limitations and was seconded by Commissioner Sorensen.

Mayor Trantalis explained it means the exclusive right of occupancy, expounding on details. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Commissioner Sorensen commented on the ability of Staff to address vacation rental concerns. Vice Mayor McKinzie commented on registered and unregistered vacation rental homes. Further comment ensued on regulating vessels in a similar manner as vacation rental homes. Anthony Fajardo, Director of the Department of Sustainable Development (DSD), commented on the ability of vacation rental home software to address the renting of vessels, stating that Staff would research.

Mayor Trantalis opened the public hearing.

Commissioner Glassman commented on input received regarding the willingness of parties to meet and discuss this item.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Tyler Chappell, Chappell Group, 714 E. McNab Road, on behalf of the applicant. Mr. Chappell gave a presentation regarding this item.

A copy of this presentation is attached to these minutes.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Mr. Chappell explained that this item addresses the installation of boat lifts on existing docks previously approved by two (2) Resolutions in 2014 and 2017.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Commissioner Glassman said there were neighbor issues regarding the size and noise of the boat lifts, expounding on related details. Mr. Chappell discussed previous conversations with surrounding neighbors and subsequent letters of approval received. He discussed the applicant's interaction with the Adagio Condominium (Adagio), expounding on modifications made to address concerns and related details.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question, Mr. Chappell confirmed there are six (6) slips and the lifts would be in slips two (2) and five (5), explaining details. The slips sizes are not changing. Commissioner Glassman noted the need for clarification from counsel representing Bayshore Towers Condominium (Bayshore Towers). Mr. Chappell discussed additional details illustrated in the presentation.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question regarding the applicant reaching out to Bayshore Towers following the first approval from the Marine Advisory Board and prior to this lift application, Mr. Chappell said there was no response when representatives of the applicant communicated with Bayshore Towers via email and phone.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Randy Bookbinder, owner representative for Adagio. Mr. Bookbinder explained written communications and subsequent replies from Bayshore Towers and The Shore Club Condominium (Shore Club) expounding on details that included an offer to meet with Board members.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question, Mr. Chappell confirmed previous support from Bayshore Towers and the Surf Club when a previous application came forward without lifts.

In response to Commissioner Sorensen's question, Mr. Chappell said that the lift would raise the boat between five (5) and ten (10) feet above the existing dock structure.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Jeremy Shir, Becker, One East Broward Boulevard, and designated representative of Bayshore Towers. Mr. Shir explained outreach efforts to the applicant on the day of the MAB Meeting.

Mayor Trantalis reviewed the previous dock waiver approval, noting this request for dock lifts would not exceed the previously approved dock waiver. Mr. Shir explained that the lifts are in forty (40) foot slips, expounding on details. Mayor Trantalis commented that permits were issued and other aspects of this item. Further comment and discussion ensued.

There being no one else wishing to speak on this item, Commissioner Sorensen made a motion to close the public hearing which was seconded by Vice Mayor McKinzie. Roll call showed: AYES: Commissioner Sorensen, Commissioner Glassman, Vice Mayor McKinzie, and Mayor Trantalis. NAYS: None.

Commissioner Sorensen introduced this Resolution which was read by title only.

Commissioner Glassman commented on his perspective regarding item PH-3, confirming a desire for neighbors to communicate. He noted previous concerns had been clarified, stating questions have been answered and confirmed his support of this item based upon the information before the Commission. Mayor Trantalis concurred, commenting on his perspective. Further comment and discussion ensued.

In response to Commissioner Sorensen's suggestion for the parties to meet, representatives of the applicant and Bayshore Towers confirmed. Commissioner Glassman concurred with the benefits of a meeting to allow for a clear understanding and the ability to move forward as

neighbors on a positive basis.

Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 515 Idlewyld Drive for the Installation of a New Concrete Dock and Elevator Style Boat Lift -(Commission District 2)

Mayor Trantalis opened the public hearing.

Mayor Trantalis recognized David Nutter, B&M Marine Construction, Inc., on behalf of the Applicant. Mr. Nutter spoke in support of this item, explaining details regarding the waiver of limitations request due to the shallow nature of the area waterway.

In response to Mayor Trantalis' question regarding the seventy-eight (78) foot waiver into the waterway, Mr. Nutter explained the distance from the wet face of the seawall to end of the dock is thirty-three point two (33.2) feet, an excess of eight (8) feet from what is currently permitted.

In response to Commissioner Glassman's question, Mr. Nutter explained that this item went to the Marine Advisory Board (MAB) with a different configuration and was approved. At that time, the Army Corps of Engineer denied it because the "L" shape design and distance into the waterway.

Mr. Nutter addressed the Army Corps of Engineering concerns with a distance reduction of the dock extension into the waterway. All subsequent necessary approvals were received.

There being no one else wishing to speak on this item, Commissioner Sorensen made a motion to close the public hearing which was seconded by Vice Mayor McKinzie. Roll call showed: AYES: Commissioner Sorensen, Commissioner Glassman, Vice Mayor McKinzie, and Mayor Trantalis. NAYS: None.

Vice Mayor McKinzie introduced this Resolution which was read by title only.

Public Hearing to Adopt a Resolution to Designate the Colee Hammock Neighborhood as a permanent Residential Parking Permit District - (Commission District 4)

Mayor Trantalis opened the public hearing.

Commissioner Sorensen gave a brief historical review of the Residential Parking Program (Program), confirming the successful implementation of a trial Program and desire to make the Program permanent with minor adjustments.

City Manager Chris Lagerbloom explained details regarding this Program that primarily covers the Colee Hammock neighborhood. He discussed modifications addressing Mr. Elfman's gated townhome neighborhood located north of Broward Boulevard that has limited parking. An additional nuance relates to employee parking for community medical facilities along SE 15th Avenue. The Program's updated Ordinance language addresses these two items.

Commissioner Sorensen expounded on the nuance related to medical facilities' staff parking. In response to Mayor Trantalis' question, Commissioner Sorensen confirmed his support of the Program subject to the two nuances discussed by City Manager Lagerbloom. Further comment and discussion ensued on identifying these two nuances within the Program. City Manager Lagerbloom confirmed he would address the wording of the Program area in the Ordinance with City Attorney Boileau.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Susan Lazarus, 1405 SE First Street. Ms. Lazarus spoke in support of this item, commenting on concerns regarding medical staff parking at the medical facilities. Comment and discussion ensued on this topic.

Mayor Trantalis confirmed the need for neighbors and area businesses to peacefully co-exist and the nature of the Colee Hammock neighborhood. City Attorney Boileau confirmed there would be a limitation on the number of permits allowed for medical staff.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Charles King, 105 N. Victoria Park Road. Mr. King requested additional information on the Program. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Laurence Wechsler, 1400 SE Second Street. Mr. Wechsler commented on the parking situation prior to Program implementation, expounding on details and noting improvements.

Commissioner Sorensen confirmed Program permits would not be issued to restaurant employees, explaining related details. Seven (7)

parking permits would be issued for medical facility staff and two (2) for Mr. Elfman. Further comment and discussion ensued.

Mayor Trantalis recognized John Van Hise, 1409 SE First Street. Mr. Van Hise commented on the positive impact of the temporary Program in the neighborhood, noting recent concerns. Commissioner Sorensen confirmed the recent expiration of the temporary Program, expounding on related details. Mr. Van Hise expounded on concerns related to medical staff parking.

Mayor Trantalis recognized Ray Brasted, 1405 SE First Street. Mr. Brasted commented on his perspective, support of this item and encouraged minimal changes to the temporary Program.

There being no one else wishing to speak on this item, Vice Mayor McKinzie made a motion to close the public hearing which was seconded by Commissioner Sorensen. Roll call showed: AYES: Commissioner Sorensen, Commissioner Glassman, Vice Mayor McKinzie, and Mayor Trantalis. NAYS: None.

Commissioner Sorensen introduced this Resolution as amended which was read by title only.






EXISTING MARINA APPROVED BY CITY RESOLUTION NO.14-183 ON NOVEMBER 4, 2014


