9:00 am 1. Mayor's Welcome and Introduction

Mayor Trantalis called the Priorities and Goals Setting Session to order at 9:07 a.m.

Mayor Trantalis announced details regarding the virtual format of this meeting, including how members of the public can listen and view.

9:10 am 2. 2020 Commission Priorities accomplishments/successes

City Manager Chris Lagerbloom provided a recap of 2020 significant events and priorities, expounding on details.

A list of 2020 City Commission Priorities is attached to these Minutes.

Raj Verma, Public Works Director, responded to questions related to sewer and stormwater progress and potential programming of available funds.

Susan Grant, Finance Department Director, clarified how revenues apply to stormwater projects. Mr. Verma confirmed the City's goal to complete as many projects as possible.

City Manager Lagerbloom explained aspects of Consent Order requirements completed ahead of schedule. Mr. Verma expounded on details, confirming his goal to complete all Consent Order requirements as soon as possible.

City Manager Lagerbloom expounded on the City's role in the COVID Vaccine Program and provided an update on the City's contribution and

coordination with providers in response to COVID-19.

Staff was commended for moving forward with priorities during the COVID-19 crisis.

10:10 am 5. Identify 2021 Commission Priorities

City Manager Lagerbloom presented a summary of the 2021 Commission Goals and Priorities.

Discussion ensued on ranking and clarifying the draft list of 2021 Commission Goals and Priorities.

There was a Commission consensus to continue working through the break.

12:15 pm 7. Working Lunch:

City Manager Lagerbloom provided a brief overview of the Budget Advisory Board (BAB) request for Commission direction regarding applications for nonprofit organization funding and making recommendations to the Commission.

City Manager Lagerbloom reviewed the *Commission's Nonprofit* Funding Target Area Category List.

A copy of the Nonprofit Funding Target Area Category List is attached to these Minutes.

Discussion ensued on BAB vetting and alignment with Commission direction for nonprofit funding recommendations. City Manager Lagerbloom recognized Budget Advisory Board Chair Brian Donaldson. Chair Donaldson explained examples of how the BAB would rank nonprofit funding requests.

Commission discussion ensued regarding grant programs included in the *Nonprofit Funding Target Area Category List*. Chair Donaldson requested Commission direction and clarification regarding ranking grant programs.

Laura Reece, Director of the Office of Management and Budget, explained details of past funding to elderly nonprofit organizations that were matched to Federal pass-through funding.

City Manager Lagerbloom explained *Nonprofit Funding Target Area Category List* funding includes both General Funds and General Funds that leverage pass-through funds. Further comment and discussion ensued on CARES funding, grant funding impacting General Fund nonprofit funding, meeting nonprofit funding goals and previous 2020 nonprofit funding.

Chair Donaldson recapped 2020 nonprofit funding and commented on the increase in 2021 nonprofit application funding requests. The BAB will consider matching pass-through funding in the ranking process to maximize return-on-investments.

There was a Commission consensus to base ranking and recommendations on key components, including leveraging and conforming to *Nonprofit Funding Target Area Categories*. Comment and discussion ensued on the need for nonprofit organization inclusion and nonprofit application funding requests belonging to a *Commission Nonprofit Funding Target Area Category*.

Chair Donaldson confirmed sufficient Commission direction for vetting and making recommendations to the Commission regarding 2021 non-profit organization funding application requests that best benefit the City. The BAB would consult Staff as necessary for clarification regarding nonprofit applications in areas having existing funding under a respective *Nonprofit FundingTarget Area Category*.
