**TITLE**: Resolution Delegating Authority to the City Manager to Execute a Small-

Scale Derelict Vessel Removal Project Agreement with the Florida Inland

Navigation District (FIND) in an Amount not to Exceed \$4,688 -

(Commission District 4)

## Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Commission adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to Execute a Project Agreement between the City of Fort Lauderdale and the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) providing funding from FIND in the amount of up to \$4,688, but in no event more than 75% of the City's out of pocket costs ("Project Amount") for the removal of a derelict 24' vessel from the Intracoastal Waterway (hereinafter "Project") and any other documents reasonably necessary and ancillary to the implementation and completion of the Project Agreement and Project.

### **Background**

The Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) administers the Waterway Assistance Program (WAP) program. FIND provides funding assistance to local governments within the District to provide public access to area waterways through boat ramps and floating docks.

On June 15, 2021, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission and the City of Fort Lauderdale Marine Police Unit deemed a 24 ft. abandoned powerboat derelict, which sank in Lake Sylvan. On July 28, 2021, Mikes Marine salvaged the vessel and properly disposed of it at a total cost to the City of \$6,250.

The City applied for funding assistance and was awarded funding up to \$4,688, or 75% of salvage/disposal costs of the project. The remaining cost of \$1,562 to remove the vessel will be acquired from the Broward Boating Improvement Grant which was awarded to the City in 2019.

## **Resource Impact**

This action will result in a positive impact to the City in the amount of \$4,688, which will be appropriated to the account listed below contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 21-1111.
