TITLE: Resolution Rescinding Resolution 21-126, and Approving a Landscape

Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement for State Road 5 (US1) with the Florida Department of Transportation for Landscape Improvements within

the Right-of-Way of State Road 5 - (Commission District 2)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution rescinding Resolution No. 21-126, and approve and authorize the City Manager to execute a Landscape Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for landscape improvements within the right-of-way for State Road 5 (US 1) between Mile Post 0.638 to Mile Post 0.732, in substantially the form attached, with approval by the City Attorney's Office as to the manner of execution of the agreement by the parties.

Background

On July 6, 2021 the Fort Lauderdale City Commission passed Resolution 21-126 authorizing the City Manager to execute a Landscape Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement (MMOA) with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for the purpose of the City maintaining the landscape improvements within the right-of-way on State Road 5 (US 1). The City transferred the landscape improvement requirements to the property developer through a hold harmless agreement, which was passed by City Commission on July 6, 2021.

Since the passing of these agreements, FDOT discovered the landscaping was not installed as per FDOT approved plans, attached herein as Exhibit 3, and has required that the developer submit a revised landscaping permit, attached herein as Exhibit 4. The described changes need to be incorporated into a revised Exhibit B to the MMOA, which will subsequently be included as part of the hold harmless agreement between the City and the developer.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
