Always keep safety the primary non-negotiable priority. Hire responsible staff and trained, experienced industry veterans. Design the display with new effects and the widest variety and appropriate shell size selection. Design audio and show choreography that excites and engages the viewers and spectators and those who may view it remotely via different media sources.

### PROJECT RISK IDENTIFICATION

Identification as well as managing and mitigating the project risks that will occur are central to project success. Equipment, product, transportation, safety, security, logistics, staffing and weather are significant areas of anticipated risk. Contingencies, risk owners and assigned responsibilities are Risk Register items. e.g. (Two operators assigned to the display in the event a sole operator became unavailable due to unforeseen circumstances).

#### PERFORMANCE

Coordination of people and activities, constant auditing and review are controls that keep Exposhows projects on-track, on-time and within budget. Timelines for completion risks coupled with project strategy have always led to successful product delivery.

### **Technical Proposal and Work Plan**

#### **Project Design**

The Annual City of Fort Lauderdale July 4th Fireworks is an audiovisual celebration of the freedom of America and contemporary Florida. It showcases the City as a premier tourist and recreation destination with world class beaches, arts, entertainment and the United States in form and function as universal symbols of connectivity, stability, growth and innovation. A celebration of Americas' cultural and social diversity and a salute to local veterans.

The Fireworks Finale display brings the sky to life. It celebrates July 4th and our history from the beginning to the present. The dynamic synergy of our United States is portrayed through a menagerie of light and music symbolizing greater reliance, sustainability and independence of America.

#### Safety and Security Plan

All Exposhows employees undergo mandatory annual Safety seminar Certification and have recent show experience. All State licensed operator(s) and pyrotechnicians are registered Federal BATFE Employee Possessors and cleared by the DOJ to handle explosives. Additional training and compliance with OSHA High Hazard Employer Workplace Injury and Illness Prevention Plan is administered to all employees.

Daily safety meetings and pre load-in safety briefings are given on-site. All Exposhows HME (HazMat Endorsed) commercial drivers participate in DOT mandated random drug testing Ébackground checks Abb a Acleal abb & by the TSA Abb a Abb a additional insured on Exposhows Commercial Transportation Liability policies.

Access to the Fireworks barge is restricted. The barge will be staged at Port Everglades and subject to USCG and DHS Maritime Security (MARSEC) levels and the authority the of Broward County Fire Marshal. An Exposhows staff member remains on-site from loadin of explosives until all unfired explosives material is secured and show truck has left the Port following demobilization of the barge.

Fireworks Barge access proper on-site and on-station is restricted to pyrotechnic team members, barge operator staff, Broward County Sheriff's Office and City of Ft. Lauderdale Public Safety. In addition, access is permitted to designated City Event staff. Any and all visitors must be cleared by City Public Safety and escorted by licensed operatorÁà^{ { \A} a[ &å] \* Áàæ\*^È Only City Public Safety, Broward County Sheriff's Office Aor Licensed Operator has authority to permit access at their discretion.

#### Permit, Sponsor and Public Safety Coordination

All permits filings and fees required by Federal agencies; DHS, USCG and FAA, Port Everglades, Broward County Sheriff's Dept and City of Fort Lauderdale Fire Dept in accordance with U.S., State and local Áaws will be submitted by Exposhows after contract endorsement and approval. City of ÁFort Lauderdale, its elected officials, officers, employees, volunteers, guests, agents and Ápublic safety agencies will be listed as additional insured on Exposhows general liability Áand Workers Comp policies.

#### Music for Fireworks Show

Exposhows will submit the proposed audio track for review and approval by event staff not later than May 15, 2022. Approved audio track may be modified to include pre-show and/or post show narration at the direction of the event director. Following approval, coordination with and digital distribution of the audio program to the City's media partner, or simulcast with a local radio station will be completed.

#### Pre-Event Meetings

Any pre-event firework meeting(s) or site walk-throughs with City or public safety dept. will be attended by the project manager [ assigned display operator(s)

#### Itemized List and Delivery of Display Equipment

Equipment will be delivered to the Port Everglades after mobilization of the fireworks barge. Equipment list includes HDPE 3" - 8" mortars and racks. 8" HDPE and steel 10" Mortar Guns and racks constructed in accordance with and exceeding minimum safety standards and approved rack stabilization methods. 8" and 10" mortars will be stabilized in sand filled barrels and placed remotely to the main display.

Use of a digital firing system with built in safeguards consistent with safe operation and best practices. All applicable modules, cables, connectors related to the firing system. E-match, quick match and 22-2 low voltage zip wire used to connect fireworks to firing modules. Fire suppression equipment, foil and Visqueen (polyethylene plastic) and additional 50" x 50" tarps for display protection during barge transit and in the event of inclement weather conditions.

#### Equipment Delivery / Marine Load In

Fireworks will be delivered via secured Hazmat licensed truck to Port Everglades Fireworks Barge staging site on Sunday, July 3rd. Hazmat Transportation Permit documents include the travel route of the truck. Authority with Jurisdition will be advised prior to arrival the ETA of the truck and when truck arrives on-site.

Product remains secured inside the truck until such a time licensed operator in charge determines display is ready for product loading and following any required inspection by Broward County Sheriff's Dept and/or City of Fort Lauderdal Fire Marshal.

Following completion of shell drop and wiring of all main display and finale chain shells, field modules will be connected and the field will be cleared by the Operator in Charge to prepare for system continuity checks. A loud verbal "Clear Field" announcement confirming a secure safety perimeter is made every time the firing panel is energized.

Entire duration of the display from the opening shot to the final finale cue will be fired electronically and choreographed to the pre-approved audio soundtrack.

#### **Display Description**

The main body display consists of single shot and multi shot aerial shells and effect shells. Shells may be fired in tandem to a faux finale, building again in intensity for a finale that will engage multiple chained shells and single shot support shells. A breakdown of shell effect types is detailed

Sky pictures are used in main body, rapidly fired choreographed sequences that create visual panoramas that represent gold waterfalls with pink stars, sunset rainbows and provide an outstanding, multi-layered horizon to horizon experience.

#### **Display Operations**

Entire duration of the display from the opening shot to the final finale cue will be fired electronically. Any preshow test or announcement shots will be electronically fired.

Fireworks barge will arrive on-station at the designated firing site approximately 3 hours before the opening shot of the display and remain until the conclusion of the show.

After arrival of the barge to a location proximate to the firing site, display will be uncovered and signal testing with Aà^Á&[}å`&c^åÅ, ãc@ the media partner. Display operator and pyrotechnic team will be in protective gear prior to arming firing system for final continuity test(s) and the display. Protective gear includes long sleeve 100% cotton long sleeve and long pants, hard hats, eye and ear protection. Sponsor and Fire Safety Officer will be advised when continuity testing is complete.

All event staff other than production pyrotechnicians and Fire Safety Officer must be clear of designated safety perimeter 30 minutes before display start. After the safety perimeter is clear, an all-clear signal is given by the operator and on-site Fire Safety Officer to ensure public safety.

Following pre-show staff safety briefing, all non-essential  $\bullet cae$  will depart the barge and deploy to the c<sup>\*</sup> a as a fe distance for the duration of the display.

Sponsor will be notified that firing system is armed and "hot" approximately 15 minutes before the scheduled start of the displays. Start of the display is ultimately under the control of the sound booth or media partner at the discretion of the sponsor.

All members of the public and event staff must be clear of the safety perimeter 30 minutes before display start. After the safety perimeter is clear of all non-authorized vessels, an all-clear is given. Firing system will be armed and hot approximately 15 minutes before the scheduled start of the display. Start of the display is ultimately under the control of the sound booth or media partner at the discretion of the Pyrotechnic Operator and Fire Safety Officer who makes final safety decisions.

Firing Systems in use by Exposhows contain a deadman switch that enables an immediate cease fire in the event an unsafe condition exists that may jepoardize public safety. No aerial shells are chained or ganged in the main display which prevents any additional breaking aerial shells from firing in the event of a cease fire. The display may then be resumed at the discretion of the Operator and the Fire Safety Officer.

#### Post Display Safety

Due to heat generated by shell lifting chages, the firing field will not be approached for 30 minutes following the conclusion of the show. It is not uncommon for unfired shells to launch following a display due to intense heat generated following a finale barrage.

A post display proximate field sweep will be conducted. during cool down. Team members  $\hat{A}_{j}$  a isolate and secure any duds or aerial shells that were observed to malfunction for containment.

If all shells are accounted for by spotters and burst counts match, an all clear within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the display is anticipated. Following a firing field cool down, all guns will be inspected for unfired shells by the licensed Operator in Charge and an assistant.

Any unexploded ordinance will be removed, secured and stored in a safe manner before any equipment or site tear down is initiated. Deck debris will be collected in accordance with Environmental Best Practices prior to returning to the Port. 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Display Equipment Strike and Clean Up

Substrates and surfaces used to stage all equipment and pyrotechnics will be returned to their original condition following completion of the display. All collected debris and byproduct materials will be removed and discarded in a manner consistent with best practices and responsible project management. Weather or unforeseen conditions withstanding, Exposhows will supply all materials and staff necessary to complete loadout and cleanup in accordance with scheduled completion dates.

### Industry Leading Best Practices

Safety is always the first priority and non-negotiable with any public event. Our Safety Compliance operates within the scope of Fireworks Best Practices, always maintaining safe distances, using the best equipment, trained staff and vigilant in observing safe pyrotechnic operating protocols and methodology.

Advances in digital, wireless fire control systems and an increase in equipment construction minimum standards have made the pyrotechnic display industry safer for pyrotechnicians and audience members over the past two decades.

Contingency planning is always a hallmark of successful project management. Failure to plan can result in a display cancellation and compromise safety. Exposhows plans for occurences such as inclement weather with standby polyethylene protection for loaded fireworks batteries in the event of a cloudburst or precipition. Use of 6mm Visqueen allows the display to be fired even during rainstorms or conditions of high humidity.

The condensed footprint of our firing site configuration allows for an additional coverings to be deployed over the entire display that allows staff the ability to continue wiring the display under cover during any constant prolonged downpour of rain.

Exposhows maintains a Marine Discharge of Fireworks Best Practices Blueprint. An excerpt is attached at the end of this section for Evaluation Committee review.

### Environmental Responsibilities

Aerial Fireworks to be used for the City of Fort Lauderdale July 4th Displays are comprised of biodegradable cardboard, craft paper, string, tape, glue, black powder, metal salts, (colorants) dextrin and rice. Debris is collected and bagged prior to barge movement back to the Port Everglades berth and the home port.

Of primary environmental concern are 3 meter copper and plastic shielded electronic ignition wires. Used with every shell, it is secured to each mortar via strain relief, attached to directly to the mortar upon launch of the shell to eliminate any environmental impact or copper wire discharge into the marine environment.

Grady Marine is supplying a speciality barge for the City with 4 foot walls to prevent any debris from entering the marine environment. All deck debris is collected after the display before the barge returns to the Port, an integral keystone of our Best Practices.

Any proximate theatrical and stage fireworks used are low smoke, eco-friendly, selfconsuming devices with no fallout and use cardboard, nitrocellulose and colorants. Our vendor, Ultratec is the world leader in ecofriendly proximate pyrotechnics supplying the Olympics and professional sport venues

#### MSDS

MSDS are required by DOT in accordance with regulations governing Hazardous Materials Transportation on public roadways in the United States. MSDS for all fireworks that will be on-site are included in the transportation permit package.

### Hazardous Materials Transportation

Exposhows is a Federally licensed Hazardous Materials Shipper and has Interstate operating authority to transport Explosives and Hazardous Materials on public roadways throughout the United States.

Exposhows (USDOT# 2053003) maintains all current required permits that include FMCSA Hazardous Materials Interstate Transportation Permit, FMCSA Satisfactory Rating & PHMSA Registration. Exposhows carries a \$5,000,000 Commercial Transportation Policy, required by law to conduct any Transport of Hazardous Materials on Public Roadways in the United States.

Transportation of Hazardous Materials (Explosives and Fireworks) are done in house by Exposhows employees who are also licensed operator(s) for the 2022  $\hat{O}ay$  of Fort Lauderdale  $\mathbb{R}'|^{2} \mid COA OA' \subseteq \mathbb{A}'$  [ $|\cdot| \cdot A OA' = \mathbb{A}'$ ] are subject to the requirements and regulations of 49 CFR that include random drug testing, physicals and DHS background checks.

### Explosives Storage

#### VIII. FIREWORKS DISPLAY COMPANY BEST PRACTICES – MARINE SURFACE WATER DISPLAYS

Methodology and techniques to prevent and reduce debris and chemical byproducts into surface waters by Marine based discharges of aerial firework shells and composition is the cornerstone of a proactive plan that accomplishes minimal impact on the aquatic environment.

Realizing that technological advances and innovations may lead to additional and improved methods to mitigate and thus further improve pyrotechnic composition discharges into surface waters, additional control methods not listed should be observed and acted on by firework display companies to achieve the goal of continuing to remain vigilant and contain discharges associated with fireworks.

 Current pyrotechnic compositions for aerial shells include the use of black powder and metal salts that contain perchlorates and nitrates. Perchlorates occur naturally on earth and in the water. Sea water perchlorate concentrations of 150 ppm have been recorded and at even higher rates in estuarine waters, up to 10,000 ppm in brine <sup>(1)</sup>. Perchlorate concentrations in several species of seaweed have ranged up to 16 ppm. <sup>(2)</sup>

Pyrotechnic chemists are always looking for new ways to reduce perchlorate use in fireworks compositions to reduce any impact on the environment. Alternate oxidizers including nitrocellulose and other polynitrated compounds are consistently being tested to one day provide "eco friendly" fireworks that feature sustainable byproducts and minimize environmental impact. Until the time they become cost effective, readily available and performance characteristics emulate black powder deflagrations and detonations, the industry will continue to primarily use nitrates and perchlorates to launch and detonate aerial effect firework shells.

- The point discharge site should be in a location that is contained and not pose a wide dispersal path based on wind, ocean currents and tidal flows. Debris will be more geographically concentrated, and any recovery will be more manageable, resulting in a greater percentage yield of collected and recovered shell debris components.
- 3. Following the display Exposhows shall, to the extent practical, collect, secure, remove, and manage particulate matter and debris from ignited and un-ignited pyrotechnic material including aerial shells, stars (small pellets of composition that produce color pyrotechnic effects), paper cardboard, wires and fuses found during inspection of the firing range and directly adjacent affected surface water(s).
- 4. Fireworks discharged from barges or marine vessels, the barges or firing platform shall have containment walls or gunwales that shall <u>not</u> be open to the water to prevent debris from entering the water. Fireworks equipment setup shall be inside containment walls or gunwales.
- 5. Shielded copper e-match leads from each shell to the electronic contact point shall be hard wired to the mortar so they remain on the firing platform and do not become separated from the firing system upon shell discharge, pull into the air or allow a lead to enter the surface water.

- 6. HDPE or steel mortars and all equipment used to hold and launch fireworks shall be secured on the deck inside containment walls to prevent any loss of integrity that would result in a mortar going into the water.
- 7. Barges must have a USCG Load Line rating and must have been inspected within the last 12 months for leaks and other potential safety issues. AWJ Permit must have a valid USCG and DHS Marine Event Permit and FAA Notification for the display.
- 8. A spotter shall be present at the discharge point that can accurately determine if any shell has been launched and did not perform as expected, returning to the water with solid pyrotechnic product and marking its approximate position for immediate retrieval following the display. All surface debris on the water shall be collected immediately following conclusion of the display.
- 9. As soon as firing site is deemed safe, and no later than 30 minutes following the display completion, the deck of the Barge or marine vessel shall be swept for loose debris and solid waste before getting underway. Collected debris is to be bagged and secured so no loose debris and other solid waste blows into the wind or enters surface waters.
- 10. All debris including fuses, wires, and wrappings shall be properly disposed in recyclable or landside trash receptacles as the fireworks display is set up and prior to marine transport to the discharge point.
- 11. Fireworks shall be packaged, transported, stored, set-up, and handled in accordance with CCR, Title 19, Division1, Chapter 6, *Fireworks* & Title 22, Chapter 33, Best *Management Practices for Perchlorate Materials* to prevent or minimize firework pollutant wastes from entering surface waters.
- 12. Marine based firework discharges and resultant residual pollutant waste discharges shall be located a sufficient distance from areas designated ASBS (Areas of Special Biological Significance) or SMA (State Marine Preserves) to assure maintenance of natural water quality conditions in these areas.
