Proposal Submitted by Fort Lauderdale Studio Initiative LLC to Develop, Construct, Operate, and Maintain a Full-Service Movie Studio Complex at 1400 NW 31st Avenue, and Authorizing Negotiations for a Proposed Interim and/or Comprehensive Agreement in Accordance with Section 255.065.

Florida Statutes - (Commission District 3)

### Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission consider a resolution providing notice of the City Commission's decision to proceed with the unsolicited proposal submitted by Fort Lauderdale Studio Initiative LLC to develop, construct, operate, and maintain a full-service movie studio complex on city-owned property located at 1400 NW 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, commonly known as the former Wingate incinerator site, and authorizing negotiations for a proposed interim and/or comprehensive agreement, in accordance with Section 255.065, Florida Statutes.

#### **Background**

On April 20, 2022, the City received an unsolicited proposal pursuant to Section 255.065, Florida Statutes, to develop, construct, operate, and maintain a full-service movie studio complex on city-owned property located at 1400 NW 31st Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, commonly known as the former Wingate incinerator site. The proposer submitted the required application fee of \$25,000 in accordance with Resolution No. 13-187.

In Resolution No. 22-95, the City Commission determined that the proposed project would serve a public purpose as an educational and cultural facility and a public facility or infrastructure that is used and will be used by the public at large or in support of an accepted public purpose or activity, and constitutes a qualifying project pursuant to Section 255.065, Florida Statutes (2021). The City advertised and accepted other proposals for the same project in accordance with Section 255.065, Florida Statutes, for a period of twenty-one (21) days after the initial date of publication, or before 5:00 p.m. local time on May 31, 2022. The City did not receive any competing proposals during the aforementioned timeframe.

If and when a proposed interim and/or comprehensive agreement with Fort Lauderdale Studio Initiative LLC is negotiated, the City Manager will present the proposed agreement to the City Commission for its review and consideration. Furthermore, pursuant to Section 255.065, Florida Statutes, the approval of the qualifying project by the City of Fort Lauderdale is subject to entering into a comprehensive agreement with Fort Lauderdale Studios Initiative LLC, and the City of Fort Lauderdale may reject the proposal until such time a comprehensive agreement is executed.

#### Resource Impact
