- TITLE: Preliminary Rate Resolution for the Fire Assessment Establishing the Estimated Fiscal Year 2023 Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Rate and Authorizing a Public Hearing on September 12, 2022 (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a preliminary rate resolution setting the Non-Ad Valorem Fire Assessment Fee at \$321 per residential dwelling and establish the date of September 12, 2022 at 5:01 P.M. to hold a public hearing at City Hall, 100 North Andrews Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, 33301 to consider public comments.

Background

The City Commission authorized the creation of the Fire Assessment Program to fund the fire services, facilities, and/or programs that will benefit the City in its entirety, such as facility improvements, special equipment, and cost of fire suppression operations on June 15, 1999 (Ordinance C-99-49). Annually, the City establishes an assessment rate to fund continued fire services and operations for the upcoming year.

The City proposes a \$321 per residential dwelling unit, which is an increase of \$10 per Residential Dwelling Unit over last year. For Fiscal Year (FY) 2023, the proposed assessment is \$51,392,242 which is estimated to generate \$49,850,475 in revenue to the General Fund. Based on historical information, the staff projects a 97% collection rate.

The City Manager is required per Section 197.3632 (5)(a), Florida Statutes to certify the non-ad valorem assessment rate to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2022.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
