- TITLE: Motion Approving Agreement for the Purchase of Hauling and Disposal of Silts and Soils and for the Sale of Dewatering Containers – MST Scrap Metal Inc. d/b/a MST Dumpsters - \$133,881 - (**Commission Districts 1**, 2, 3 and 4)

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Commission approve an agreement, in substantially the form attached, for the purchase of hauling and disposal of silts and soils with MST Scrap Metal Inc. (MST), in the initial three (3) year fixed and firm contract term amount of \$133,881; and authorize the City Manager to approve two (2) one-year renewal options in the estimated annual amount of \$44,627, for a potential total contract amount of \$223,135, contingent upon appropriation of funds. In addition, staff recommends the City Commission approve the competitive sale of three (3) dewatering containers to MST for a total of \$15,000.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale requires services for the hauling and disposal of street sweeping silts and stormwater silts generated through normal Stormwater and soils generated through Cemetery operations.

On June 7, 2022, the Procurement Services Division issued Invitation to Bid (ITB) 12680-823 for Hauling and Disposal of Silts and Soils and Sale of Dewatering Containers. On July 6, 2022, the City received a total of four (4) bids. Three (3) bidders claimed local business preference and one (1) as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE).

Staff determined that MST, both a local vendor and a DBE, met the bid requirements and is the low, responsive, and responsible bidder.

The Invitation for Bid included line items to competitively sell three (3) dewatering containers. Three (3) total bids were received. MST is the high, responsive, and responsible bidder with a total offer (revenue) of \$15,000 for the three (3) containers.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City in FY 2022. Future years' expenditures are contingent upon the approval and appropriation of the annual budgets.
