**TITLE:** Resolution Approving the Fiscal Year 2023 Central Wastewater Region  
Large User Rate of \$2.55 per 1,000 Gallons of Wastewater Treated –  
**(Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)**

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**Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Commission adopt a resolution setting the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Central Region Wastewater Large User rate at \$2.55 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated, effective October 1, 2022.

**Background**

The City, through Large User Agreements, operates the Central Wastewater Region facilities, including the George T. Lohmeyer Wastewater Treatment Plant (GTL). The Central Wastewater Region provides treatment services for five cities including Fort Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Wilton Manors, Tamarac, and parts of Davie. This accounts for approximately 83 percent of the wastewater treatment services provided by the Central Region.

The Large User Agreements, necessitated by federal funding requirements, establish the methodology for setting rates for large users. The City Commission establishes a billing rate based upon budgeted expenditures and assumed gallons of wastewater to be treated for the upcoming fiscal year. At the close of the year, the fund is audited, and the actual rate is determined. If necessary, lump sum rebates or charges are made to adjust the amount paid by each user based upon the actual rate.

The Wastewater Large Users Regional Advisory Board, at its July 20, 2022 meeting, voted and approved a rate of \$2.55 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated. This rate represents a thirteen-cent decrease from the FY 2022 rate of \$2.68 per 1,000 gallons of wastewater treated. The Central Regional Wastewater Operating Budget for FY 2023 is \$37.4 million.

**Resource Impact**

The FY 2023 Central Wastewater Region Large User rates will generate \$36,704,719 in estimated revenues.
